



Friday, July 12 at Colton Recital Hall in the College of Fine Arts featuring chamber strings, opera, chamber choir and additional small ensembles.

The USD Summer Music Camp is open to students who have completed grades 5-12 and includes music instruction and performance opportunities with members of the USD Music faculty. Activities include vocal and instrumental ensembles, as well as a variety of other musical activities. Opportunities for private lessons in a specific instrument or voice are also available. Registrations are still being accepted.

Rangers from Missouri National Recreational River will open the Dakota Territorial Capitol replica in Yankton's Riverside Park from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. today (Monday) through Wednesday, July 3.

This week's exhibit will be "National Parks: America's Best Idea," a compilation of photos taken by park rangers and volunteers across the country, featuring more than 40 of America's most famous and lesser-known special places. Discover the immense variety of the 400-plus sites that Congress and the presidents have set aside to preserve our natural wonders and cultural heritage.

The capitol will also be open Friday, July 5, with the usual exhibits of historic Yankton photos and the model of the steamboat *Far West*. Visitors may also join the ranger for a walk to the Meridian Bridge and a short talk on the natural or cultural history of the Missouri River at 11:30 a.m., 12:30 p.m. and 3 p.m.

Students will meet with advisors to plan class schedules at the registration sessions.

New, incoming students are reminded that their ACT or COMPASS scores must be on file at Northeast before registration. If the student

has not taken the COMPASS test, he or she is encouraged to contact the Northeast Testing Center at (402) 844-7281 or the College Center at (402)241-6400 to schedule an appointment to complete the test prior to registration. Those completing the testing prior to registration will expedite the registration process and finish earlier than those who haven't been tested.

Any student who has not attended Northeast in the past or is not a current student, should call the Admissions Office at (402) 844-7260 about filling out an application and signing up for a registration session.

An orientation for new students is planned for Sunday, Aug. 18, from 12:30-4:30 p.m. It will begin in the Cox Activities Center gym on the Northeast campus in Norfolk.

Federal regulations require anyone applying for a new, renewal or duplicate driver license or identification card to provide the documents listed below (photo copies are not acceptable):

- ONE of the following to prove identity, date of birth, and lawful status: Certified U.S. birth certificate issued by county or state (no hospital birth-certificates); valid unexpired U.S. passport; Certificate of Naturalization; Certificate of Citizenship; valid unexpired permanent resident card; valid unexpired employment authorization document; foreign

passport with valid unexpired U.S. Visa with I-94

If your name is different than the name on your identity document, you will need to bring additional proof of your legal name. Acceptable documents for proof of legal name change are a certified marriage certificate (issued by a state vital records agency), a certified adoption document, or a certified court order authorizing a name change (such as a divorce decree). If you have had multiple marriages, you will need to bring similar documents providing legal proof of each name change. The examiners must be able to trace from your birth name to your current name.

- ONE document to prove your Social Security number: Social Security card, W-2 Form, SSA 1099 Form, Non-SSA 1099 Form, pay stub (must include name and Social Security number). The regulations do not allow personnel to accept any other document as proof of Social Security number.
- TWO documents to prove your residential address. A parent's proof of address is acceptable for a minor child. Bring two of the documents listed here (each must contain your current address): Utility bill, credit card statement, pay stub or earnings statement, rent receipt, phone bill, transcript or report card from accredited school, bank statement, mortgage document, tax document, homeowners/renter's insurance policy. Other items will be reviewed by licensing personnel. PO Box addresses are acceptable in areas not assigned street or 911 addresses. In South Dakota, if you are unable to provide proof of residency, visit www.dps.sd.gov or call 1-800-952-3696.

NOTE: In South Dakota, application must be submitted at least one hour in advance of scheduled closing time. No drive tests will be given from 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m.

- The Missouri river was too high this morning to allow the old ferry boat, the *Clara S.*, which was coming down river with a load of cottonwood logs, to pass under the Meridian highway bridge here without raising the draw span, so the span was raised shortly before noon today and the boat passed through with its barge and cargo.
- Twenty-eight years ago yesterday, some records show it to be today, the capitol at Pierre was dedicated by the I.O.O.F. Doane Robinson's "Encyclopedia of South Dakota" gives the dedication date as June 30, 1910, while the chronology of events in the official "Blue Book," the South Dakota Manual, the date of dedication is mentioned as (July) 1, 1910
