BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly fell Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery fell 5 cents to \$6.60 a bushel; September corn fell 6.5 cents to \$5.2575 a bushel; September oats added 1.25 cent to \$3.6025 a bushel; while August soybeans fell 9.25 cents to \$14.32 a bushel.

Beef prices were mixed, while pork prices rose on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

August live cattle was flat at \$1.2195 a pound; August feeder cattle rose 0.85 cent to \$1.5180 a pound; July lean hogs rose 0.73 cent to \$1.0235 cents a pound.
