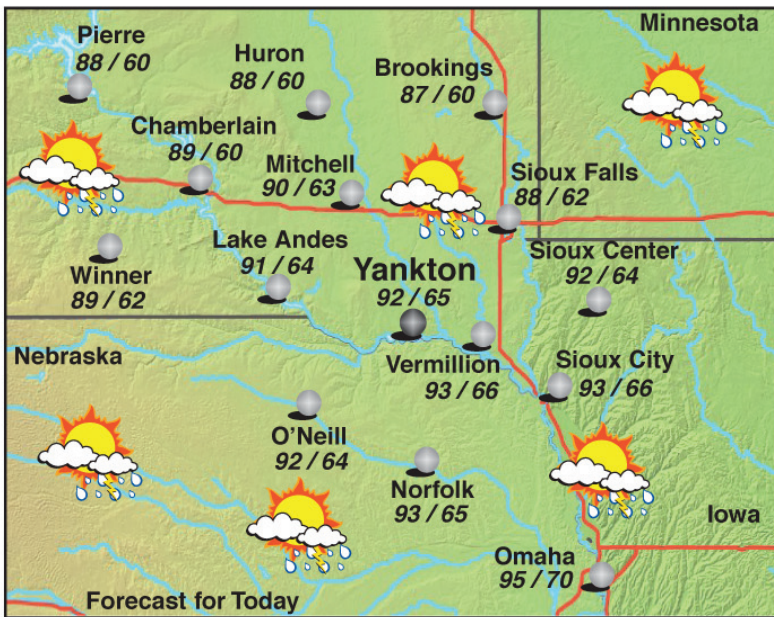

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures mostly rose Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
 Wheat for September delivery rose 3 cents to \$6.63 a bushel; September corn rose 7.5 cents to \$5.3325 a bushel; September oats fell 3.25 cents to \$3.57 a bushel; while August soybeans jumped

23.5 cents to \$14.555 a bushel. Beef prices were mixed, while pork prices fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
 August live cattle rose 0.12 cent to \$1.2207 a pound; August feeder cattle fell 0.20 cent to \$1.5160 a pound; August lean hogs fell 2.20 cents to 95.55 cents a pound.

ON THIS DATE

75 YEARS AGO

Saturday, July 9, 1938

- The annual picnic and reunion of the class of school children who attended the old "dugout" school which was opened to what is now Marindahl township, Yankton county, in 1874 was held in Lincoln park at Mission Hill yesterday at which thirteen members of the old class were present.
- One of the fastest softball teams in Sioux City, the Honolulu Conservatory of Music club, will meet the Yankton Walnut Tavern softballers here at the Cedar street park tomorrow night at 6 o'clock in a twilight game. Last year the visitors were defeated in the finals of the Iowa state softball tournament and their teams this year is even better than last year's and has been doped by fans to take the Iowa state tourney this year.

50 YEARS AGO

Tuesday, July 9, 1963

- Fifty-mile swimmers last year were Steve Feimer and Jeff Green, who swam 50 miles in the Yankton Memorial park swimming pool during the 1962 summer season. They were the only two of nine who started the 50-mile swim and Stay Fit program then who completed it and received certificates, pins and emblems from the Yankton county Red Cross chapter.
- Before its annual reorganization, the Yankton board of education moved Monday night to make the old Central school site at Sixth and Walnut streets available to the city for use as a public parking lot.

- The Yankton Library is again asking the Yankton City Commission for funds so it can join the South Dakota Library Network.
