humor and high-energy music to the grandstand, Dybdal said.

"The first time I saw the Dweebs was at Riverboat Days (in Yankton). I thought they were very entertaining, and wondered, 'Why not bring them to the Cedar County Fair?'" he said. "They are very talented musically. They are attired in outfits that are a little different, but that's what makes their show so different."

Looking at other grandstand events, Dybdal said the rodeo has become a major draw since its 1996 inception as part of the fair.

"We've gotten 155 contestants entered in this year's rodeo, with 90 in performance and 60 during the slack, so we have a lot of contestants," he said. "We have had riders in the past from Texas, Wyoming and North Dakota. They come from all over the nation."

The rodeo draws amateur contestants from about a dozen states, with their points counted toward their respective associations, Dybdal said. While not part of the PRCA circuit, the Cedar County Fair has attracted pro riders in the past, he added.

Sunday's demolition derby marks the first time for the event at the Cedar County Fair in more than 15 years, Dybdal said.

"It's exciting to see something new and different coming in," he said.

The fair features a host of family-friendly events during its five-day run, Dybdal said. "Thursday, we have a big hamburger feed before the rodeo," he said. "We have a

tending that questions on the forms violate the Americans with Disabilities Act. The board reprimanded her last year for employing a physician assistant who was not licensed.

"I think it's clear that I have fought government. I have fought bureaucracy and I have learned you can't run from doing what is right simply because the odds are against you," she said of her past experiences with the board.

we can't let our vigilance down," she said. "Mosquitoes are out there that cause West Nile, and we usually start to see more cases later in the summer — July, August and September."

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, South Dakota saw 203 WNV cases in 2012, with three reported deaths.

Johnson said her hospital reported seven positive tests for WNV between June 1 and Nov. 1 last year (four outpatient and three inpatient), and those positive results all occurred in August and September.

One of several mosquito-borne viruses in the United States that can infect people, WNV can cause flu-like symptoms and, in rare cases, severe encephalitis (inflammation of the brain).

"Not everybody gets it, and some people who do get it get lighter cases, while other people get serious cases," Johnson said. "The majority of people — 4 out of 5 — don't show any symptoms at all."

Symptoms typically begin 3 to 14 days after the mosquito bite, she said. Most people who show symptoms will have mild discomfort and might suffer from fevers, headaches and body aches for a short time, she said.

"One out of 150 are going to go on to be much sicker than that," Johnson added. "They're going to have high fever, really bad headaches, disorientation and just feel terrible."

A small percentage of those people will develop encephali-

tis, she said. The inflammation can cause severe headaches, high fevers, stiffness, disorientation, coma, tremors, convulsions, weakness and paralysis. "The serious illnesses can sometimes carry on for a long time — for years even," she said.

While there is a WNV vaccine for horses, no vaccine exists for humans, Johnson said. Therefore, it is important to take steps to prevent infection, she said.

To prevent mosquito bites and reduce the risk of WNV, the S.D. Department of Health recommends the following:

- Use mosquito repellents (DEET, picaridin, or IR3535) and limit exposure by wearing pants and long sleeves in the evening;
- Limit time outdoors from dusk to midnight when Culex mosquitoes are most active;
- Get rid of standing water that gives mosquitoes a place to breed;
- Support local mosquito control efforts.

According to the department, those who are at high risk for WNV include people over 50, pregnant women, transplant patients, individuals with diabetes or high blood pressure and those with a history of alcohol abuse. Preventative measures are especially important for these individuals, as well as timely medical assistance should infection occur.

"If people develop fever and headache and confusion, they should see their doctor right away," Johnson said.

The activity will remain non-stop, right up to the fair's closing, Dybdal said.

"We have the carnival, food, exhibits and entertainment, all the way through Sunday night," he said. "It's going to be a busy time."
