Yankton's Kinsley Wins Minneapolis Lifetime Fitness Triathlon

MINNEAPOLIS — Kip Kinsley, a Yankton graduate who competes in track and cross country for South Dakota State University, won the elite men's division of the Lifetime Triathlon on Sunday in Minneapolis.

Kinsley finished in 1:04:26.71, nearly a half-minute ahead of the next competitor, thanks to a blistering 16:07.89 in the 5K run section of the race. His time on the run was four seconds faster than the next fastest on that portion, and 1:14.70 faster than Brian Duffy of West Chester, Pa., who placed second overall.
