Missouri National Recreational River, southeast South Dakota's and northeast Nebraska's only national Park, will present the following ranger programs this weekend:

- Friday July 19
— Chief White Crane Campground Amphitheater, 7 p.m.: "Life on the Missouri" — Live reenactment: Was river-boat life all adventure, excitement, and romance? Decide for yourself as the purser of the steamboat Far West talks about the challenges of the Big Muddy and his adventures traveling the river with the famous Captain Grant Marsh, including the wild ride from the Little Bighorn. Chief White Crane campground is at the east end of Lake Yankton, below Gavins Point Dam. Free; state park entrance fees apply.
- Saturday, July 20
— Springfield boat ramp, 9 a.m.: "Missouri River Institute Paddle Event" — Explore the winding channels of the Lewis & Clark Lake delta near Springfield with a National Park Ranger. Applicants Sought By USDA For Rural Education, Health Care Grants

WASHINGTON — Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack has announced that USDA is accepting applications for grants to provide access to education, training and healthcare resources in rural areas. Funding is authorized through the Department's Distance Learning and Telemedicine (DLT) Grant Program.

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) remains focused on carrying out its mission, despite a time of significant budget uncertainty. Today's announcement is one part of the Department's efforts to strengthen the rural economy.

"With access to the latest technology, America's rural citizens can compete in today's global economy," Vilsack said. "These Distance Learning and Telemedicine grants will modernize equipment and improve healthcare services and educational opportunities for residents in remote areas. They will help generate jobs in small towns and revitalize rural economies."

Under this notice, USDA may provide up to \$17.5 million in grants. Funds can be used to buy equipment and provide technical assistance. To be eligible, applicants must serve a rural area, demonstrate economic need and provide at least 15 percent in

matching funds. Awards range up to \$500,000. In 2012, USDA Rural Development provided 58 DLT grants for projects in 36 states. Since the program began, 1,400 projects have been funded.

For example, in 2012, USDA Rural Development awarded Educational Service Unit 16-Ogallala, Nebraska funds for distance learning to be used in a system-wide upgrade to outfit schools with video conferencing equipment and updating their video bridge in this vast sparsely populated area of Southwest Nebraska. The modernized bridge unit is better able to leverage available bandwidth. This allows for richer content to run through the system while using less bandwidth expenses, thus saving on connection expenses. The project will provide students and others in their communities with expanded curriculum offerings, virtual travel opportunities and career advancement.
