'Capital' Events Set For Viborg Today

VIBORG - Gov. Dennis Daugaard will talk with area residents about rural businesses, community development and health care reform at today's (Monday's) "Capital For A Day" in Viborg.

Daugaard and his wife, Linda, are visiting the Turner County community for the "Capital For A Day" visit. The event, which rotates at sites around the state, allows citizens to interact with the governor face-to-face without traveling to Pierre.

The Daugaards will take part in a number of activities while in town, according to Viborg city officials.

The governor will take a walking tour of Main Street this morning and stop at five businesses. He will be ac-

companied by Mayor Kyle Christiansen and other City Council members, along with Glenn Petersen, president of the Viborg development corporation.

The same party, along with other selected residents, will then take a longer tour of three other Viborg businesses.

Also during the morning, the first lady will read for children at the Viborg library. She is scheduled to arrive at 10 a.m. and read for about 30 to 45 minutes.

After completing his morning tours, the governor will attend a roundtable discussion regarding rural community development. The luncheon, by invitation only, will include local business owners, leaders of various local organizations and District 17 Reps. Ray Ring (D-Vermillion) and Nancy Rasmussen (R-Hurley). District 17 covers Turner

and Clay counties, including Viborg.

In the afternoon, Gov. Daugaard will host two events for the public at the Viborg Community Center on the south end of Main Street. At 1 p.m., the gover-nor will lead a roundtable discussion focusing on national healthcare reform. At 2 p.m., he will host a constituent coffee hour where he will meet one-on-one with those in attendance.

To conclude the day, Daugaard has agreed to tour the Viborg museum when he finishes at the Community Center, around 3 p.m.

Viborg was founded in 1893 by Danish settlers, and Daugaard comes from Danish descent.
