Yankton Police Save Woman From Drowning

Yankton police pulled a Nebraska woman from the Missouri River early Sunday morning as she was on the verge of drowning.

À report was received at 2:05 a.m. that Diana Starbuck, 28, of Plattsmouth, Neb., had gotten into an argument with a male and ran south from downtown Yankton.

"A friend of (Starbuck) flagged down one of our officers," said Lt. Mike Burgeson. She said her friend had been drinking and took off toward the river.'

An officer was checking along the bike path in Riverside Park when he noticed an unconscious Starbuck in the water near the handicap dock.

Two officers got in the water to retrieve the woman while two others assisted from the shore, according to Burgeson.

'The four officers involved in this incident saved this woman's life — no doubt about it," he said. "Within 30 seconds, she would have been under water, and we would have lost her."

Burgeson said Starbuck was transported to the hospital by the Yankton County

EMS. Yankton County Search and Rescue also came to the scene but was not needed.

Starbuck was released from the hospital later Sunday morning.

Burgeson said it is not known how she ended up in the river.

"She could have fallen in. She could have jumped in," he stated. "(Starbuck) does not remember hardly anything.'

Ăt attempt by the Press & Dakotan to reach Starbuck Monday afternoon at a phone number listed for her was unsuccessful.

Officers Rob Buechler, Jeremy McNinch, Brad Parker and Monty Rothenberger were involved in the rescue. Burgeson said they will be recognized for their actions at a Yankton City Commission meeting next month.

After a river incident several years ago, Burgeson said an effort was made to equip officers with the training and necessary tools — such as life jackets — to handle such situations. That equipment and training paid off Sunday, he stated.

Alcohol Was Involved In Fatal Charles Mix Crash

PICKSTOWN - Alcohol was involved and charges are planned in the July 8 fatal crash near Pickstown, the South Dakota Highway Patrol said Mon-

Ronald Ray Fischer, Jr., of Lake Andes had a Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) more than twice the legal limit, when the vehicle he was driving struck and killed Robert Klumb of Pierre and Maegen Spindler of Cazenovia, N.Y. Fischer's vehicle failed to stop at the

stop sign located where U.S. Highway 18 intersects with S.D. Highway 46. The vehicle then traveled into a private parking lot, where it hit Klumb and Spindler.

The case has been turned over to Thomas Deadrick, the state's attorney in Charles Mix County.

"An arrest warrant has been issued

for Fischer on two counts of vehicular homicide," Deadrick said. Capt. Kevin Joffer of the South

Dakota Highway Patrol said, "These charges stem from the investigation our troopers conducted regarding this

tragic crash." No further information is immediately available.




