The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) received and reviewed an application for a revision to a minor air quality operating permit for the following applicant:

Applicant Name: Kolberg-Pioneer, Inc.

Location: 700 West 21st Street, Yankton, South Dakota

The minor air quality operating permit will be revised to include the following two units: Unit #19 - 2012 Alltra Hypertherm HPR-260 Hi-Def plasma burn table; and Unit #20 - 2012 Alltra Hypertherm HPR-400XD bevel plasma cutting table.

A review of the application indicates Kolberg-Pioneer can still operate in compliance with South Dakota's Air Pollution Control rules and the federal Clean Air Act. DENR recommends the Board of Minerals and Environment revise Kolberg-Pioneer's existing minor air quality operating permit with conditions to ensure compliance with SDCL 34A 1 and the federal Clean Air Act.
