CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures were lower Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for September delivery was down .5 cent at \$6.5325 a bushel; September corn fell 14.25 cents to \$5.0825 a bushel; September oats were 7 cents lower at \$3.4575 a bushel; while August soybeans dropped 70 cents to \$13.9250 a bushel. Beef and pork prices were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle fell 0.33 cent to \$1.2157 a pound; August feeder cattle fell 0.58 cent to \$1.5302 a pound; August lean hogs were lower .25 cent to \$0.9892 a pound.

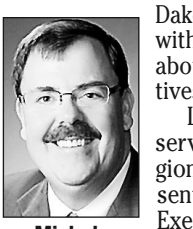
