Church Jargon Is Misunderstood



I was reading a layperson's perspective in one of my denomination's newsletters and was jolted by the writer's statement that she has "watched with consternation as the church has drifted away from orthodoxy." I have grown accustomed to hearing misuse of theological terms like "conservative" and "liberal" by

people who have no clue what they really mean, but the present quote reminded me that intelligent conversation is possible only when the participants understand the terms

The term *orthodox* is commonly understood as "right belief" as opposed to error or heresy, but we need not be locked into a fixed set of "right" beliefs, especially regarding social issues. Rather, the Christian church is continually reforming itself. We stop evolving as a church only when we stop thinking, and then we are dead. Being "orthodox" is not a virtue.

'Conservative" is commonly used as if a person were conservative in all



neatly categorized by superficial labels, and so are the hot button issues that face our churches. We cannot dismiss an idea as not being "orthodox" just because it differs from the way we have been thinking. Many times over just more than a century, an unorthodox view has become mainstream. The Church, unfortunately, has repeatedly argued on the wrong side of numerous social issues including slavery, integration, and interracial marriage. You are no doubt thinking of another hotbutton issue that is likely to change in the near future. Let us, please, be open to the idea that we may be wrong

People are too complex to be

erate" movement in theology. Rather, "liberal" and "conservative" in theology are distinct movements developed at the start of the 20th century when the nation was in turmoil over labor issues and so-called "progressives" who favored such radical ideas as labor unions and the right to strike. The "social gospel" was born. Some progressive churchmen of the day (and in those days they were men) were wrestling with issues of science versus religion. (Remember, the Scopes "monkey trial" was in 1925.) Those progressive churchmen took the radical view that truth is truth wherever you find it and were derisively called "modernists" by another group of churchmen who set out to conserve traditional religious beliefs, to prove the Bible true in every detail, and to find the historical Jesus. In so doing, they were dubbed "conservatives," in opposition to the modernists who were labeled as "liberal" and who to this day continue to affirm that all truth is God's truth and not to be feared.
