New Mount Marty College men's basketball coach Andrew Baker announced five signings, including three from South Dakota, for the 2013-14 season. Zach Cox of Mission, Nermin Krdzalic of Sioux Falls, Mitchell Newhouse of Rapid City, Austin Schweers of Ponca, Neb., and Zach Telles of Lakewood, Colo., will all attend MMC and play for the Lancers, the institution has announced.

Cox, a 5-11 guard from Todd County, averaged 24.2 points, six rebounds and 3.7 assists per game. He was named 1st team All-Conference and was also named the Class A Player of the Year by sportsbuzz.com.

We definitely have a winner in Zach Cox, Baker said. "He can score from multiple levels on the floor and understands the game very well."

"Nermin is going to be a nice presence at the point guard position," Baker said. "He is going to give us length and a competitive fire needed from that position.

Newhouse, a 6-6 forward from Rapid City Central, averaged six points, six rebounds and two blocks while shooting 58 percent from the field. Newhouse was named Honorable Mention All-Conference and will also be a thrower on the track and field team for the Lancers. "He is a very big, very strong athlete," Baker

said. "I am excited to get him in the gym and develop him into a dominant post player for us." Schweers, a 6-3 guard from Ponca, led his

team in scoring at with 13 points per game. Schweers earned 1st team All-Conference, Honorable Mention C1 All-State, Northeast Nebraska All-Area as well as academic all-state. Schweers will also be a member of the MMC golf team.

"Austin is a nice size guard that is a good offensive player and makes smart basketball plays," Baker said. "He will continue to grow as a player and can be a great asset for us moving forward."

Telles, a 5-9 guard from The Academy High School. led his team in scoring with 23 points per game and averaged 5.2 assists, and 3.9 steals. Telles also led all of 3A in scoring at 23 points per game, which was also good for 3rd in the entire state of Colorado. He was named Honorable Mention All-State, was 1st team all-conference, and conference player of the year.

"Zach Telles is a proven shooter and can definitely help us stretch the floor," Baker said. "He has a bright future ahead of him and we are excited to have him.

Buell Named Scholar Athlete Of The Year; USD Teams In Top-10 For GPA VERMILLION — Bethany Buell was named the

Division I Outdoor Field Scholar Athlete of the Year, eight Coyotes were named to the All-Academic Track and Field team and both men's and women's track and field teams placed in the top-10 for team GPA according to releases by the U.S. Track and Field/Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) on Wednesday.

Buell is the first Summit League athlete to receive a USTFCCCA Scholar Athlete of the Year honor, and was named a Capital One Academic All-American earlier this summer.

"I couldn't be more proud of Bethany and this award speaks volumes to her academic prowess and her athletic excellence," USD Athletic Director David Herbster said. "Bethany winning this award sends the message that South Dakota student athletes can and will compete for both academic and athletic excellence on a national level.

Buell was also named the women's Summit League Outdoor Field Athlete of the Year and earned All-American honors during both indoor and outdoor seasons.

'I'm thrilled that Bethany has been recognized for her academic and her athletic accomplishments," USD's faculty athletic representative Tina Keller said. "She has been a wonderful ambassador for USD, and her accomplishments show that South Dakota student athletes will continue to shine at the national level."

Along with Buell, five women and two men were named to the All-Academic Track and Field Team. Pole vault teammates Emily Grove. Madison Mills and Hunter Wilkes all joined Buell with women's All-Academic team honors, as did hurdler Alexa Duling and high jumper Megan Glisar. Hurdler Erik Hill and distance runner Jeff Mettler were named to the men's All-Academic team.

The women's track and field team also had the seventh-best cumulative team GPA in Division I according to the USTFCCCA, finishing with a mark of 3.53. The Coyotes, who placed 18th at the NCAA Division I Outdoor Track and Field Championships last month, were one of two Summit

League programs in the women's top-10. The team's GPA was better than all Big 10 teams, all ACC teams and seven Ivv League teams.

The Coyote men tied Dartmouth College for the 10th-best men's team GPA in Division I at 3.31. The men had the best GPA in the Summit League and topped all Big Ten schools. 11 ACC schools and six Ivy League schools.

Wofford had the top women's team GPA at 3.61 while Arizona had the best men's GPA at 3.511.

Scholar Athlete of the Year Awards are determined from those who earned All-Academic status and placed highest in individual events at the NCAA Championships. Those who earn multiple individual championship titles rank higher in the tie-breaking process, and cumulative GPA is weighed as the final tiebreaker. Separate awards are given to track athletes and field athletes for the indoor and outdoor seasons.

To qualify for the USTFCCCA All-Academic Track and Field Team. a student athlete must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.25 and have met either of the following athletic standards: for the indoor season, a student athlete must have finished the regular season ranked in the national top 96 in an individual event or ranked in the national top 48 (collective listing) in a relay event on the official NCAA performance list provided by TFRRS.org; for the outdoor season, a student athlete must have participated in any round of the NCAA Division I Championships (including preliminary rounds)

'This is one of those rare days when you want to curse those short fences," he said as the pitcher in him showed through. "I was lucky this spring - the wind was blowing in every time I pitched at home. At least I'm not pitching today."

The Watertown native, in his second year of coaching, has enjoyed working with a Red Sox squad that has a good working knowledge of the game of baseball.

"I've picked up a lot playing college baseball, and you'd think some of that is too deep for 15-year-olds," he said. "But these kids work hard."

Working with younger players has also helped Wieseler realize that his playing days are numbered.

'They've heped me appreciate my time playing," he said. "I realize I only have one more year of organized baseball left (as a player), and I need to make the most of it."
