SCHOOL BUS SCHEDULES

2. If the athlete will be in Grades 7 or 10, or has never participated in athletics in the Yankton School District but plan to participate in the 2013-2014 school year, they must; a. Fill out an Initial Pre-Participation History form; and

b. Have a physical taken at the Yankton Medical Clinic or have their personal licensed health care provider complete their physical. There will be a flat fee of \$15.00 and the clinic will not file any insurance claims for the exam.
