lockdown of the school system due to comments made on Twitter by Travis Potts that were interpreted as threatening by school and law enforcement officials. He recently pleaded guilty to obstructing a law enforcement officer and was sentenced to one year of probation with 30 days of jail suspended, and a \$384 fine. A mental evalua-

tion was also ordered for Potts. "It's sad that, as a community, we had to deal with this circumstance of two very concerning issues in a short period of time," Klimisch said. "I do believe (Potts and Termansen) are going to make better decisions and encourage others to make better decisions. That's what

I want.' Klimisch said law enforcement and school officials reacted properly in both cases.

'When you have circumstances like this, you have to take them seriously. The ramifications are so great," he said. "Law enforcement and the school system did a great job. It's important to have their support, and they have my office's support, too. It goes both ways."
