FIFA Reveals Details Of Rio Police **Ticketing Probe**

RIO DE JANEIRO (AP) — FIFA says 131 World Cup tickets, including 70 for corporate hospitality packages, were seized by Rio de Janeiro police investigating ticket scalping.

FIFA marketing director Thierry Weil says 60 tickets were originally issued direct to the public. One came from the Brazil football federation.

Weil says all but two tickets were for previous matches which the scalping ring seemed to have been unable to sell. It is unclear how many tickets the scalpers had already sold illegally.

Rio police suspect a person of influence with FIFA was a source for tickets which Brazilian law forbids being re-sold for profit

Weil says "there is nobody from FIFA who has been approached by any of the police."

Police focused on the Copacabana Palace Hotel where senior football officials are staying.

Nigeria Heading For FIFA Ban Over Interference

RIO DE JANEIRO (AP) - Nigerian officials are not backing down after sacking the entire national football federation leadership, ignoring a FIFA directive and risking an international ban for the reigning African champion.

A weekend meeting of football and government officials endorsed the earlier sacking of Nigeria Football Federation Pres-ident Aminu Maigari and his executive committee.

The meeting — which FIFA said it would not recognize also decided to plan new elections. The NFF is being led by an official appointed by the sports minister.

FIFA does not allow governments to interfere in football affairs and has given Nigeria until Tuesday to reinstate Maigari or face sanctions.

Delegates at the meeting said Maigari was responsible for embarrassing Nigeria at the World Cup by not resolving a player payment dispute. He was arrested on his return from Brazil.

NEW YORK (AP) — The four World Cup quarterfinals aver-aged more than 10 million viewers in the United States combined on ABC, ESPN networks and Spanish-language Univision

Host Brazil's 2-1 win over Colombia in a 4 p.m. EDT kickoff Friday on ESPN was the most-viewed of the game with 11.84 million: 6.35 million on ESPN and 5.49 million on Univision. The Netherlands' penalty-kicks victory over Costa Rica following a 0-0 tie in the late game Saturday on ESPN was seen by 10.92 million: 5.79 million on ESPN and 5.13 million on Univision.

In the noon EDT kickoffs, Germany's 1-0 win over France on Friday on ESPN2 was viewed by 9.6 million (4.89 million on ESPN and 4.71 million on Univision) and Argentina's 1-0 victory over Belgium on ABC on Saturday was seen by 8.81 million (5.18 million on ESPN and 3.63 million on Univision).
