For example, the USD women have a weekend series with North Dakota State (Jan. 15) and South Dakota State (Jan. 17) on a Thursday and Saturday, respectively.
And on the road, USD will visit Fort Wayne (Jan. 22) and IUPUI (Jan. 24) on the same weekend trip.
Without knowing the conference men's schedule (it will be released Wednesday), fans will see doubleheaders on the 2014-15 schedule.
Over the years, there has been debate across league members about having doubleheaders, according to Johnston.
"Most women's teams are hesitant to play a doubleheader, because they feel like they are sharing a particular day with the men, and maybe the men's teams feel that way too," he said.
Although, the more people a school can put in the stands would help with exposure, he added.
"The reality is a lot of the women's programs in our league need more exposure, so I think it's probably a good thing across the board," he said.
If exposure means increased attendance, doubleheaders might just help Summit League women's teams.
After analyzing home conference game attendance figures from the 2013-14 season, one can see that all but two league teams — USD and SDSU — averaged under 1,000 fans.
SDSU led the way with 2,027 fans for conference games at Frost Arena, followed by USD at 1,632. From there, the numbers drop off: Western Illinois (890), North Dakota State (720), Fort Wayne (423), Omaha (417), Denver (411) and IUPUI (381).
Exposure to more fans, bringing in "unique" opponents to Brookings and post-season tradition have played key roles in SDSU's consistently high attendance, Johnston said.
"There are a lot of ways to get people to see your program," he said.
