SDSU Student-Athletes Log Over

6,000 Hours Of Community Service

BROOKINGS—South Dakota State student-athletes logged more than 6,200 hours of community service and volunteer work during 2013-14.

Each of the 14 Jackrabbit teams averaged more than 443 hours per team, volunteering for more than 50 projects ranging from National Girls & Women in Sports, to kindergarten swimming lessons to the Brookings Food Pantry.

SDSU student-athletes started their year of community service when the men's and women's golf, men's basketball, football, volleyball, soccer and softball teams logged 24 hours of service Aug. 22 during Paint the Falls Blue event in Sioux Falls.

Students from Hillcrest Elementary School welcomed six Jackrabbit squads during the year while seven student-athletes from the football team were at Medary Elementary School and 11 Jacks from the women's basketball team spent two days reading at Michelson Middle School.

During the holidays, South Dakota State athletic teams volunteered with Coats For Kids and Toys for Tots while helping the Salvation Army as bell ringers and purchasing and distributing Christmas gifts to local families.

One of the most successful service programs for SAAC and the teams has been The Summit League Food Fight, where student-athletes collected non-perishable food items and cash donations.

SDSU was won the "Food Fight" the past two years and three times since its inception during the 2008-09 year. Student-athletes take donations at basketball games while interacting with fans and supporters. During last year's "Food Fight", SDSU student-athletes collected 25,347.46 pounds of food, which was donated to the Brookings Food Pantry.
