

A few isolated Friday thunderstorms





Yankton Man Arrested In Tues. Pursuit

A Yankton man was arrested Tuesday night following a car chase that extended into Clay County.

Brock Brower, 30, Yankton, was arrested and charged with driving under the influence (fourth offense), grand theft, aggra-vated eluding, reckless driving, driving with a revoked, suspended or canceled license, open container and a warrant for his arrest.

Lt. Mike Burgeson of the Yankton Police Department said the incident began with the report of a stolen vehicle.

"At approximately 10:28 p.m. (Tuesday) night, officers received a report of a stolen car taken here in the city," Burgeson said. "Subsequently they located the car, and the man who allegedly took this vehicle. Our officers attempted to stop this vehicle and in the process, he fled from our officers and left town on Old Highway 50." YPD stayed in pursuit,

which began at 27th and Douglas St., and was joined by the Clay County Sheriff's Office and the South Dakota Highway Patrol. Speeds reached up to 100 mph before the Highway Patrol laid a line of spikes across the road near Highway 19 in Clay County. The spiker punctured three of the Ford Taurus' four tires and brought the suspect to

Two officers from YPD, one from Clay County and one from the Highway Patrol were involved. No injuries were reported.
