### Niobrara Man Arrested For Molestation

A Niobrara, Nebraska, man was arrested in Knox County on out-of-state charges of child molesting and performing sexual conduct in the presence of a minor.

According to a press release from the Knox County Sheriff's Office, Albert Benjamin Lucero III, 42, was taken into custody on a Lake County, Indiana, arrest warrant by the Santee Sioux Nation Police Department, assisted with the Knox County Sheriff office and the Ohliva Casino & Resort Security July 2.

The former East Chicago man has been charged in Lake Superior Court with two counts of child molesting and two counts of performing sexual conduct in the presence of a minor.

Lucero III is charged with molesting a girl, now 13, from June 2010 to June 2015 in East Chicago and Whiting, Indiana. The girl told police that Lucero had fondled her repeatedly and masturbated in front of her.

Once in custody, Lucero was taken in front of Knox County Judge Donna Taylor where he waived extradition and agreed to go back to Indiana. Lucero is being held in the Knox County Jail until Lake County, Indiana, deputies arrive to transport him to Indiana. No bond was set.

Information from the public via social media (Facebook) helped authorities determine that Lucero was still in the area and set up a plan for arresting him.

Representatives of the Indiana Department of Child Services became involved in the case and obtained a court order through Lake County juvenile court to take the girl into custody in Nebraska because of concerns for her safety.

The child molesting charges are Level 4 felonies, which are punishable by two to 12 years.

"Lots of these ones coming in toward the end are really well thought out, and a lot of them come from groups," she said. "We're seeing some really creative ideas."

Marsh said ideas cover a number of fields—ranging from suggestions for setting up "glamping" sites in the area to helping establish a specialized research facility to focus on mental health issues and even a suggestion of recreating Las Vegas' Fremont Street Experience in downtown Yankton.

Marsh added there was even an idea to help get Vermillion involved in the experience.

"There was an idea to put a train between Vermillion and Yankton along the river so people could experience the river as, probably, it was experienced long ago—via a train," she said.

But Marsh reiterated while the committee has ideas they enjoy, the decision comes down to the people of Yankton.

"We can't really say what's rising to the top," she said. "Ultimately it's up to the community of Yankton to decide that."

And Rieger said there will be a number of steps to take after the contest closes to the public.

"(Beth Rye) and I are going to get together on the 10th right away and sort through the last submissions that we haven't gotten out to the group to review and start getting those circulated," he said. "We are going to try and meet ... the 15th at the latest and we're going to really start narrowing down what we have out of our submissions to roughly 20-25 ideas that we've all read through."
