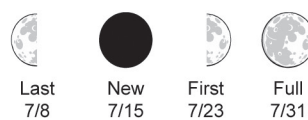

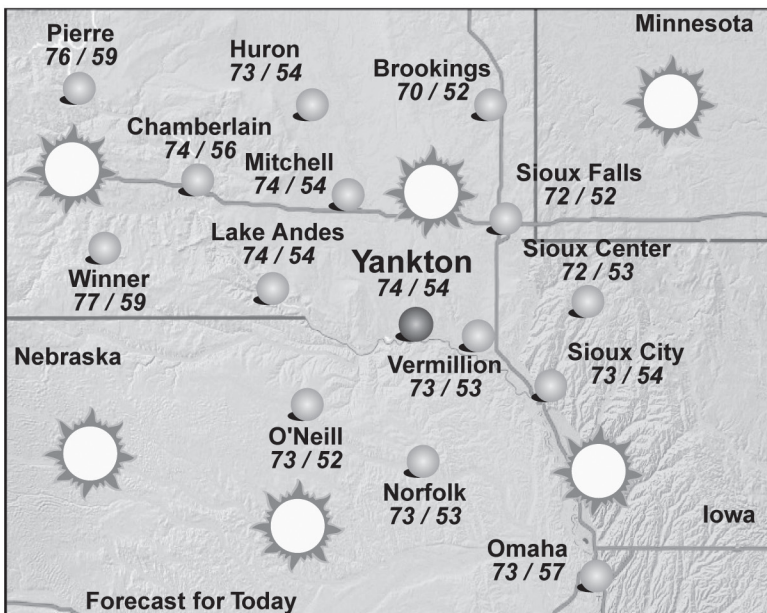

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Monday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for September delivery gained 5 cents to \$5.9550 a bushel; September corn was 2 cents lower at 4.2650 a bushel; December oats were off .25 cents at 2.7425 a bushel; while November soybeans declined 15.50 cents to \$10.1475 a

bushel. Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle was off .72 cent to \$1.5050 a pound; August feeder cattle fell .48 cent to \$2.1697 a pound; while August lean hogs were .37 cent lower to \$.76 a pound.
