Readvertisement of Notice of Permit Application No. 7112-3 to Appropriate Water

Notice is given of readvertisement of Water Permit No. 7112-3 held by Paul Buckneberg, 45886 294th St, Centerville SD 57014. Water Permit No. 7112-3 was issued appropriating 1.78 cubic feet of water per second (cfs) from one well to be completed into the Niobrara Aquifer (approximately 100-120 feet deep) located in SW 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 13 to irrigate 240 acres located in the SW 1/4, W 1/2 SE 1/4 Section 13; all in T96N-R53W. An inspection of Water Permit No. 7112-3 found 207 acres, located in the area identified above, being irrigated from two wells completed into the Pleistocene Unknown Aquifer (80 and 95 feet deep) located in the approximate center of the SE 1/4 Section 18 and the approximate center of the NE 1/4 Section 19; all in T96N-R52W. Readvertisement is necessary to add an additional well, correct the well location and properly identify the aquifer which is the Pleistocene Unknown Aquifer. Water Permit No. 7113-3 authorizes irrigation from the same wells. This readvertisement does not authorize any increase in the 1.78 cfs pump rate or acres irrigated by Water Permit No. 7112-3.

Pursuant to SDCL 46-2A-2, the Chief Engineer recommends approval of reissuance of Permit No. 7112-3 because 1) unappropriated water is available, 2) existing rights will not be unlawfully impaired, 3) it is a beneficial use of water, and 4) it is in the public interest. In accordance with SDCL 46-2A-23, the Chief Engineer will act on this application, as recommended, unless a petition is filed opposing the application or the applicant files a petition contesting the Chief Engineer's recommendation. If a petition opposing the application or contesting the recommendation is filed, then a hearing will be scheduled and the Water Management Board will consider this application. Notice of the hearing will be given to the applicant and any person filing a petition.

Any person interested in opposing or supporting this application or recommendation must file a written petition with BOTH the applicant and Chief Engineer. The applicant must file a petition if contesting the Chief Engineer's recommendation. The Chief Engineer's address is "Water Rights Program, Foss Building, 523 E Capitol, Pierre SD 57501 (605 773-3352) and the applicant's mailing address is given above. A petition filed by either an interested person or the applicant must be filed by July 20, 2015.

The petition may be informal, but must include a statement describing the petitioner's interest in the application, the petitioner's reasons for opposing or supporting the application, and the signature and mailing address of the petitioner or the petitioner's legal counsel, if legal counsel is obtained. ideas of what is categorized as suspicious activity and what isn't, according to Pluta.

Some examples of suspicious behavior could include, but are not limited to, individuals photographing public buildings' specific entrances and exits, abnormal questioning of a building's occupant(s) of its security, or a non-farmer wishing to purchase a large amount of nitrogen fertilizer.

According to the United States Department of Homeland Security (DHS) campaign webpage, individuals wanting to report any suspicious behavior within their community to their state's tip-line or law enforcement should indicate the following: who, what, where and when the activity was observed and why the activity is suspicious.

Once a call is received, the trained tip-line operators determine the degree of enforcement necessary based on the information provided.

"If an individual calls the (tip line) and (the activity) is along the lines of a public safety concern, that first call from the operator will be to the affected jurisdiction," Pluta said.

For Yankton, that call could be made to the Yankton Police Department or the Yankton County Sheriff Department, Pluta explained.

If the tip does not indicate immediate action, the operator files a report with the South Dakota Fusion Center, which then determines if any necessary follow-up is required.

Pluta said a key to the success of the "If You See

specific for Lewis & Clark. He brings it to the start, and it serves as our 'starting gun,'" Bies said.

"He said he'd do it for free if we let him fire it more than once, so we have him fire a 'start of staging' shot as well as ones at one-hour warning and one at half-hour warning as well as the 0700 starting gun."

Spectators can enjoy a view of the paddlers at various spots along the river, Bies said. Those spots include the scenic overlook near Chief Standing Bear Memorial Bridge; the boat ramp near Verdel, Nebraska; and the finish line at Springfield.

For the most part, though, the field will be spread widely along the river. "It'll be great to see so many paddlers on the river all at once," he added.

Organizers learned a number of lessons during last year's inaugural event, Bies said.

"We learned that this stretch is remarkable in terms of natural beauty and that it offers a variety of challenges for paddlers. The slack water at the start, the wind in the middle and the maze-like delta towards the finish all made it more than just a 'cruise' for those who took part in 2014," he said.

"We also figured out that this is a great first-timers' event as we had a finish rate in excess of 90 percent. We had a ton of fun last year, too, especially since most of our field was done by 8 p.m. and paddlers had a chance to share their tales in a social setting at the finish in Springfield."

In addition, organizers have incorporated a local ham radio club this year to improve the over-watch and communication, Bies said. The move was particularly important in the first segment of the event, which takes place in an area with no cell phone service, and will help the volunteers stay in touch.

ROLLING ON THE RIVER

The "50" promotes the Missouri River in two ways, Bies said.

"I think the event is special because it raises money for the river while celebrating the river in a very personal, nearly intimate way – paddling," he said. "It's also a very remote stretch. More people will summit (Mount) Everest this year than paddle the part of the river we'll explore as a group – while we see who is fastest — on Saturday." The Fort to Field 50 Paddle Battle is different than the South Dakota Kayak Challenge (SDKC) and other events, Bies said.

"It packs the punch of a longer event — 50 miles — but it's all one day and offers a way for paddlers to learn and share from one another in an amazing setting, made possible by our generous sponsors and our state and federal park hosts," he said.

Plaques will be awarded for first and second place in all categories and some prizes for the winners as well, Bies said.

However, many of the competitors will seek rewards other than a plaque and bragging rights.

"I would say about 30 percent of the participants will be 'racing' and the rest just completing the course with a group of like-minded individuals," he said. "It'll be a

safe route, and it's very pretty, with tons of chalkstone cliffs, bald eagles and their nests, and other vistas to keep even tired paddlers engaged with the natural beauty."

The event will offer an informal "seminar" time from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Friday at the starting area of Randall Creek Recreation Area. Last year's champion, Joe Zellner, will lead the exchange of ideas and seminars on paddling nutrition and technique for those enrolled in the event.

Friday will also feature the safety briefing and meal that evening. Participants are welcome to arrive early to paddle, attend the option seminar or enjoy time with the other paddlers.

Online registration runs through 3 p.m. Friday. In-person registration will be accepted at the Randall Creek Recreation Area headquarters until the event begins. However, shuttles may not be available for last-minute entrants, who should ensure they have transportation.

STRONG SUPPORT

This year's race is dedicated to the late Diana McCann, one of the founders of the Cogan House business which sponsors the Fort to Field 50. She passed away following a short illness about a month after last year's inaugural paddling race.

"Diana was among the first people in Bon Homme County who I reached out to with the idea of the 50, and she was warm and welcoming to me," Bies said. "I brought the kayak race expertise and she brought the local knowledge and community to the group."

The paddlers will take a moment Friday night to remember her contributions and to thank her family for their support in taking the event from idea to reality, Bies said.

"Without her and her family at The Cogan House, we would not have had success in our inaugural event," Bies said. "Diana got things organized, and she ran the show at the finish line, making sure everyone got fed and felt at home after a long day on the river."

The Fort to Field 50 has received strong support from sponsors and from South Dakota and Nebraska communities which have rolled out the red carpet, Bies said.

"We're excited to bring them to this part of the river, excited to share it with them and fired up to make the '50' a robust and recurring part of (the) South Dakota summer," he said.

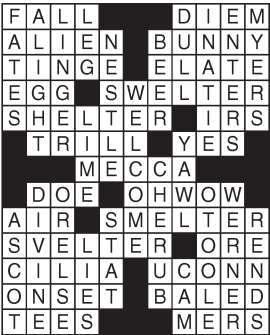

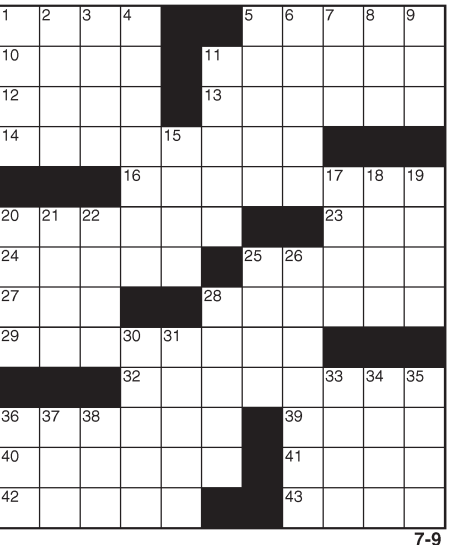
