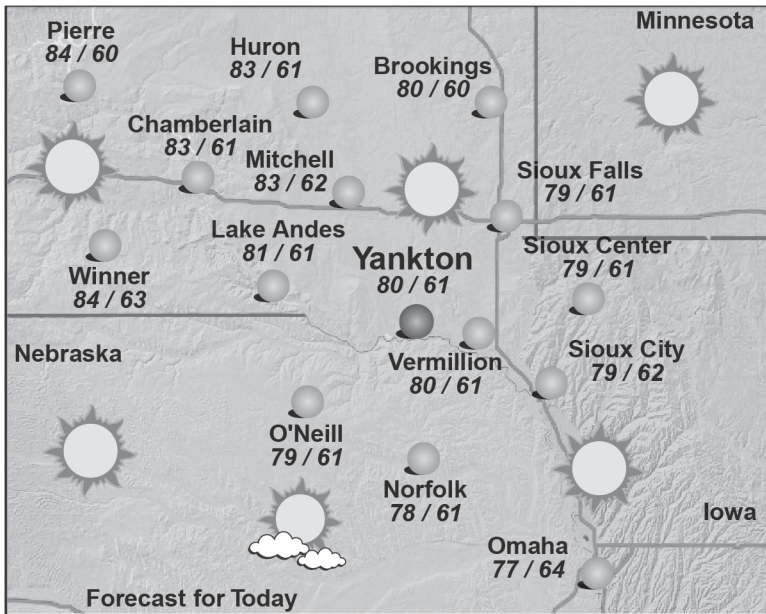

Registration Open For Garden Educator Workshops

BROOKINGS — This summer, SDSU Extension is hosting garden educator workshops for teachers and other youth educators in Sioux Falls.

This training will provide hands-on lesson plan ideas and nutrition resources for the garden, information on growing vegetables, tools for evaluation of garden programs and stories from area garden projects.

The program is designed for Pre-K through middle school teachers, after-school program leaders, school administrators, garden-focused educators, Master Gardeners and wellness committees.

Presenters will share lessons that feature specific fruit and vegetable crops to enhance food and garden education programs. The class will participate in a hands-on activity involving produce preparation and discuss resources available to promote children's consumption of fruits and vegetables. Participants will identify tools to use for evaluating garden programs at their school or organization.

A local educator share their experiences and stories of developing and utilizing educational gardens. Participants will hear about how 2nd graders were empowered to develop the Baltic School Community Garden.

The training will be held at the Sioux Falls Regional Extension Center, 2001 E. 8th St. Aug. 4, from 9:30 a.m.-3:45 p.m. Pre-registration and payment is due July 31. A partial Continuing Education Credit (.5 CEU) is also available.

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks ended lower Wednesday as trading resumed on the New York Stock Exchange following an outage of more than three hours caused by an unspecified technical problem.

The NYSE's troubles didn't extend to the dozens of other exchanges that also trade U.S. stocks, such as the Nasdaq, so investors were still able to buy and sell stocks easily.

The NYSE didn't say what the problem was but described it as internal and not the result of a breach of its systems. Trading stopped at about 11:30 a.m. Eastern at resumed at 3:10 p.m. Eastern.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mixed Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery lost 7.75 cents to \$5.7750 a bushel; September corn was 1.25 cents higher at 4.2450 a bushel; December oats were off 4.75 cents at 2.67 a bushel; while November soybeans gained 2.50 cents to \$9.8825 a bushel.

Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle was off 2.07 cents to \$1.49 a pound; August feeder cattle fell 3.50 cents to \$2.1362 a pound; while August lean hogs were .55 cent lower to \$7.580 a pound.

If another employee wasn't available, Jackley said last week the state or another county could issue a license. He said it's not unusual for other government offices to step in when there's a conflict elsewhere.

The ACLU said Jackley's suggestion that the state's duty to issue marriage license to same-sex couples is met if couple's must go elsewhere for a license "misses the mark."

"To state the obvious, forcing same-sex couples to drive to a separate county to obtain services that heterosexual couples can access in their home county is not equal treatment," the organization wrote.

Dale Carpenter, a constitutional law scholar at the University of Minnesota, said county employees act on behalf of the state government, which now cannot discriminate against same-sex couples when issuing marriage licenses.

"These are not private employees of businesses. These are representatives of the government," he said. "It's not their business to act on their conscience, it's their business to enforce the law."

Carpenter, who has filed briefs in support of same-sex marriage in the past, said even if a couple didn't have to travel anywhere else for a license, an official's refusal to issue a license would still raise a "serious constitutional question" under the equal protection clause of the U.S. Constitution.
