## **USD Men To Play Florida Gulf Coast At Sanford Pentagon**

Coyotes To Play Game In Sioux Falls For Second Straight Season

The University of South Dakota will get its crack at a school known by its 'Dunk City' moniker.

Announced Wednesday, USD will host Florida Gulf Coast – a member of the Atlantic Sun Conference – on Monday, Dec. 28 at the Sanford Pentagon in Sioux Falls.

The seventh Division I men's basketball game at the Pentagon since it opened in 2013, the matchup with Florida Gulf Coast will be the second for USD – the Coyotes lost to UNLV in front of a sellout crowd last season.

"I think it'll be fun," said Casey Kasperbauer, who will be one of

five seniors on the USD roster this

"It was fun getting to play UNLY," he added. "The seats were filled, and it was obviously mostly Coyote fans and some new faces that I haven't seen in Vermillion.'

To that end, the UNLV game last season wasn't the only barometer Kasperbauer could use for such a

Two years ago, the Coyotes played a game against Wyoming – a much more familiar opponent – out in Rapid City, which meant a whole new group of fans.

When it comes to Florida Gulf Coast, however, the only barometer would be the 2013 NCAA Tournament, when the Eagles became the

only No. 15 seed to advance to the  $\,$ Round of 16.

"We all know about their run in the NCAA Tournament. That's how I know them," Kasperbauer said.

Even with a new head coach (Joe Dooley), FGCU hasn't slowed down. The Eagles have posted three consecutive 20-plus win seasons, and last season went 22-11 on the way to a CollegeInsider.com Tournament appearance.

Florida Gulf Coast, which beat South Dakota State by 13 points last season in Sioux Falls, will host the Jackrabbits on Dec. 19 in Fort Myers. There was no announcement Wednesday if USD would make a

similar return trip to Florida. For now, the Coyotes will savor the opportunity to play in front of another sellout crowd an hour away from Vermillion.

"Our players and everyone involved with our game last year in the Pentagon had a fantastic experience," head coach Craig Smith said in the release.

'This game in Sioux Falls is a great way to play in front of our

largest alumni and donor base." Tickets go on sale next Tuesday at 11 a.m. at ticketmaster.com and at the Pentagon box office.

#### Vets, Rookies To Face Off In HR Derby

NEW YORK (AP) — The Reds' Todd Frazier is paired with two-time champion Prince Fielder of Texas in the first round of Monday's All-Star Home Run Derby in Cincinnati.

In this year's new format, Chicago Cubs rookie Kris Bryant is in a pairing with the Los Angeles Angels' Albert Pujols, Toronto's Josh Donaldson is in a bracket with the Chicago Cubs' Anthony Rizzo, and Los Angeles Dodgers rookie Joc Pederson takes on Baltimore's Manny Machado.

The Frazier-Fielder winner faces Donaldson or Rizzo, and the Bryant-Pujols winner goes against Pederson or Machado.

Brackets were based on season home run totals through Tuesday.

Each batter gets five minutes per round, and home runs in each batter's final minute stop the clock. Players can earn up to 1 minute, 30 seconds of bonus time based on home run distance.

"Swinging for five minutes, that's going to be a really long time. Really long," Pederson said. "Hopefully I don't have to go first and I can watch how some of the veterans go about it."

Pederson has selected Triple-A coach Johnny Washington to pitch to him.

"He's been with me since Day 1," he said. "It's only appropriate that he gets to come along and gets to share in this event, see how far we've come together.'

Bryant said his father, Mike, will throw to him. Mike Bryant taught Kris to hit at a young age, passing along the lessons he learned from Ted Williams during the two spring trainings he was a Boston Red Sox farmhand in the early 1980s.

"I'm probably doing it more for him so he can experience it with me," Kris Bryant said Wednesday. "We always talked about it growing up and now it's here."

Bryant thinks Rizzo may have an advantage at Great American Ball Park.
