Street Sealing To Start Next Week

The City of Yankton Street Department will begin the street seal coat program the week of July 14 and should be completed in approximately one week, weather permitting. Streets scheduled for sealing include the following:

- Valley Road — Burleigh Street to East 21st Street
- Karen Drive — Valley Road to Peninah Street
- Bradley Street — East 19th Street to Karen Drive
- Roberts Street — East 19th Street to Karen Drive
- Ross Street — East 19th Street to Valley Road
- Cedar Terrace — West 23rd Street to West 25th Street
- West 22nd Street — Douglas Avenue to Cul-de-sac
- Walnut Street — West 21st Street to West 22nd Street
- Pine Street — East 2nd Street to East 4th Street
- Memory Lane — Cul-de-sac
- Pennsylvania Avenue — Whiting Drive to East 11th Street
- East 11th Street — Burleigh Street to Whiting Drive
- East 13th Street — Mulberry Street to Burleigh Street
- West 17th Street — Broadway Avenue to Douglas Avenue
- West 11th Street — Broadway Avenue to Railroad Tracks
- West 9th Street — Broadway Avenue to Alley
- West 7th Street — Locust Street to Broadway Avenue
- West 5th Street — Linn Street to Broadway Avenue
- West 2nd Street — Linn Street to Broadway Avenue
- West 27th Street — Broadway to Cemetery
- West 27th Street — West City Limits Road to Golf View lane
- Golf View Lane — West City Limits Road to West 27th Street
- West 7th Street — Maple Street to Alley
- Alley — West 4th Street to West 7th Street/Maple Street to Spruce Street
- Alley — West 4th Street to West 6th Street/Maple Street to Green Street
- Alley — West 5th Street to West 7th Street/Broadway Avenue to Cedar Street
- East 8th Street — Burleigh Street to Ferdig Avenue

The process will be to oil the road and cover it with 3/8-inch rock chips. The streets will be closed to traffic during the seal coat process and opened to traffic immediately after the application. After one week, the street sweeper will pick up the excess chips that are still loose.

"No Parking" signs will be placed on the streets the day before they are sealed. You are asked to observe these signs and do not park on the streets until the work is done. Do not blow grass onto the street before the streets are sealed or permit underground irrigation systems to run water onto the streets while the No Parking signs are up. In the event of rain, the process may be postponed.

WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks closed slightly higher after the Chinese stock market rose. Worries that China's market rout would damage the world's second-biggest economy helped push stocks sharply lower a day earlier. Investors were also speculating that last-ditch talks between Greece and its creditors would produce a deal to prevent a Greek debt default.

The Nasdaq composite climbed 12.64 points, or 0.3 percent, to 4,922.40.

Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle was off .53 cent to \$1.4847 a pound; August feeder cattle fell 1.87 cents to \$2.1175 a pound; while August lean hogs were 2.53 cent lower to \$.7327 a pound.
