'The architecture and engineering services can come out of our 5 year capital outlay plan as well, said Jason Bietz. "As the scope gets more detailed, the cost will get more

easier to narrow.' "I think it is money well invested so we can take a really good look," Kindle said.

Another subject involved in the discussion on Monday was the new teacher evaluation system. South Dakota has state recommended minimum requirements for how often teachers are evaluated and what aspects they are evaluated on.

"The last time that our evaluation system was really looked at was in 1988 and ten years later the only improvement was to change the cover of the evaluation document," Kindle said. "Essentially, it has been nearly 30 years since the teacher evaluation has really been updated."

Yankton currently goes above the standard requirements. For example, the state recommends the teachers be observed in the classroom twice per year for their first three years of employment and once per year for four or more years of employment. Yankton currently holds six observations per year for their first three years of employment and three per year for four or more years of employment.

The state then recommends individual teacher evaluations once per year for their first three years of employment and once every two years for four or more years of employment. Yankton currently holds two evaluations per year for their first three years of employment and at least one per year for four or more years of employment.

"There is no other district in South Dakota that does this," Kindle said. "This far exceeds what the state is requiring but we felt that we want to continue to do that number because we all believe that it's really important part of the whole process."

mum of 90 cents per \$1,000, meaning \$84.15 per \$100,000 on non-ag land/homes and \$1.62 per acre on ag land. In order to meet the deadline, the Yankton County Commission will hold a special meeting on Wednesday at 11:30 a.m. in the commission chambers of the Yankton

County Government Center. Woods said there's currently a lot of road infrastructure the county oversees and a dire need to update it.

'We have about 260-plus miles of paved roads, 84 bridges that are over 20 feet long and (Highway Superintendent) Brian (Gustad) said there's countless more that are under 20 feet long," he said. "Our roads are definitely in need of repair. If you've ever driven the county roads, you can actually see the state of the roads. We could stand here for hours taking videos and showing you pictures, but I think every one of us commissioners have gotten phone calls that the roads are bad and broken up. There's a definite need."

He added that, in addition to the critical need of upgrading the county's roadways, some of the vehicles that maintain it are also in need of upgrading.

'There's two vehicles (from 1993), both of those have over 300,000 miles on them," he said. "Those things are getting used all year round."

Woods said despite all of the needs, the cash flow is just not there to begin tackling these issues and they would need to tap in to the \$3.4 million in unassigned cash left at the end of 2014 intended for emergencies to help under the status quo.

'Right now, that (2016 road) budget's at \$4.3 million and we only had \$2.7 million in revenue," he said. "So we're going to have to take from the unassigned cash to cover the roughly \$1.5 million of that shortfall. If we did seven miles of overlay, we'd have to take an additional \$1.4 million out of the unassigned general fund, which would pretty much deplete our cash reserves down to roughly half a million dollars."

Woods said every effort was made to find areas where money could be reappropriated from other departments, but not nearly

enough materialized. "There was no surplus last year, it was just that unassigned cash balance,' he said. "We looked through the budget line by line to see where we could save money to help offset this. Unfortunately, we saved money, but it's still not enough to take care of the big shortfall we

Woods said passage would have a huge impact on the county's ability to boost its road system.

"If this is passed, it would generate roughly \$1.5 million dedicated to roads and bridges," he said. "We still wouldn't be able to asphalt any roads next year, but we could start making that plan for the future years. We're going to have to think long and hard on which bridges get fixed one year and which roads get paved the other, but this at least gives us the opportunity."

He added that improved roads are ultimately the critical key developing the area's economy.

"Taking care of the infrastructure leads to so many other benefits throughout the county," he said. "There's no way to get stuff air-lifted from point A to point B everything comes in on a road.'

Woods said that despite the prospect of a tax hike, he's seen support from the public due to the need.

'I've had all positive feedback and no negative feedback whatsoever," he said. "I've talked to the other commissioners and they've had no negative feedback."

Commissioner Debra Bodenstedt was absent from Monday's meeting due to a scheduling conflict.
