**BOARD OF TRADE**

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mixed Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.  
Wheat for September delivery was off 4.50 cents to \$5.6225 a bushel; September corn was .50 cent higher at 4.30 a bushel; December oats were up 1.25 cents at 2.6850 a bushel; while November soybeans declined 5 cents to \$10.11 a bushel.  
Beef was lower and pork was higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle was off .52 cent to \$146.50 a pound; August feeder cattle lost .85 cent to \$2.1447 a pound; while August lean hogs were up .70 cent to \$76 a pound.

**WALL ST. RECAP**  
A new financial lifeline for Greece and strong corporate earnings on Thursday helped push U.S. stocks higher. Indexes rose from the start as strong second-quarter results from Netflix, eBay, Citigroup and other companies fed the buying. The rally was broad, with nine of the 10 sectors of the Standard and Poor's 500 index posting gains.  
The Dow Jones industrial average climbed 70.08 points, or 0.4 percent, to 18,120.25.  
The S&P 500 gained 16.89 points, or 0.8 percent, to 2,124.29.  
The Nasdaq composite climbed 64.24 points, or 1.3 percent, to 5,163.18.

**Manufacturing Firm Bound For Yankton, Gets State Loan**

PIERRE — The state Board of Economic Development agreed Thursday to make low-interest loans to three businesses in South Dakota planning to expand.  
Wentz Commercial Properties LLC will get a loan of \$397,000. Known as Fair Manufacturing, based at Menno, the maker of snowblowers and balers is purchasing a building in Yankton.  
The company plans to add 17 positions.  
SD Industries Inc., based at Alexandria, makes equipment for swine producers.

The company plans to add 17 positions. The loan amount is \$639,637.  
Shoemaker Properties LLC, better known as Webster Scale, will get a loan of \$343,312 for a paint booth at its Webster facility.  
The maker of scales and associated products proposes to increase its workforce by 16.  
None of the loan applications was discussed in public other than the official votes for approval. An executive session of about 20 minutes preceded those votes and other matters. The board met by teleconference.
