VERMILLION — The South Dakota women's tennis team has been recognized by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) as an All-Academic Team. Additionally, six Coyotes were named ITA Scholar-Athletes.

The Coyotes turned in a cumulative team GPA of 3.54 to earn the All-Academic Team award for the 10th time in 11 years. To earn the All-Academic Team award, the cumulative grade-point average for all varsity players must be a 3.20 or above.

Senior Rymma Maslova, senior Yamini Reddy, senior Nina Barudzic, junior Milica Pavlovic, sophomore Dragana Brankovic and sophomore Yuliya Sidenko were six of 29 Summit League women's players to be named ITA Scholar-Athletes.

To be named an ITA Scholar-Athlete, a player must be a varsity letter winner, have a GPA of at least 3.50 for the current academic year and be enrolled at their present school for at least two semesters.
