# **Parkston Man Dies In Friday Crash**

PARKSTON — A Parkston man, 52, was killed in a three-vehicle crash that occurred Friday afternoon two miles north of Parkston.

Two other Parkston residents were injured. Names of the those involved are not being released pending notification of families.

The South Dakota Highway Patrol says a 1998 Honda GL100SE motorcycle was northbound on South Dakota

Highway 37. Southbound on the same highway was a Peterbilt semi truck followed by a 2015 Buick Enclave. The Highway Patrol says the Enclave attempted to pass the semi and collided with the oncoming motorcycle and then

The motorcycle driver died at the scene. The two occupants in the car were trapped and had to be extricated. Both sustained serious non-life threatening injuries. The driver of the semi was not injured.

Highway Patrol authorities continue to investigate. Charges are pending. Other agencies responding to the

scene were the Parkston Police Department and Parkston Fire Department.
