NWU's departure will league the GPAC with 11 members, including Mount Marty College in Yankton. The College of Saint Mary, which joins the GPAC in 2015-16, offers only women's programs. Briar Cliff (Iowa), Concordia (Neb.), Dakota Wesleyan, Doane (Neb.), Dordť (Iowa), Hastings (Neb.) Midland (Neb.), Morningside (Iowa) and Northwestern (Iowa) round out the league.

The IIAC is comprised of Buena Vista, Central, Coe, Dubuque, Loras, Luther, Simpson and Wartburg.
