Box elder bugs are most abundant during hot, dry summers. The last time they were very numerous was in 1988. Since this is not a super-hot summer, the bugs are in moderation.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mixed Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for September delivery declined 8 cents to \$5.2475 a bushel; December corn was 1.50 cents higher at 4.1750 a bushel; December oats lost .25 cent at 2.5325 a bushel; while November soybeans were up 5.25 cents to \$10.0475 a bushel.
