### Reflections

# How Great Is God's Love?

What is the Love of God all about? Is it what we are seeing around us today where we see expressions followed by hate and confusion? Are we to give top priority to please ourselves, a cause or a philosophy? Does it allow then for hate with those who do not share or oppose the view we embrace? Between the preparation and publication of this article I will turn 83 (July 23rd) and I wish to take this opportunity to share some thoughts and observations from over fifty years of marriage and ministry serving Jesus Christ. May I then take this opportunity to share with you some of the hard lessons I have had to learn?

from Eugene Peterson's "The Message," a contemporary translation of the New Testament. John 3:16 is recognized as the greatest love verse in the Scriptures which reads here as follows: "This is how much God loved the world, He gave his son, his one and only son. And this is why: so that no one need be destroyed; by believing in him, anyone can have a whole and lasting life." Here is loved demonstrated by a father sacrificing his son, the highest price he could pay, for our redemption.

Another passage found in the fifth chapter of the book of Romans puts it like this: "Christ arrives right on time to make this happen. He didn't, and doesn't, wait for us to get ready. He presented himself for this sacrificial death when we were far too weak and rebellious to do anything to get ourselves

ready. And even if we hadn't been so weak, we wouldn't have known what to do any way. We can understand someone dying for a person worth dying for, and we can understand how someone good and noble could inspire us to selfless sacrifice. But god put his love on the line for us by offering his son in sacrificial death while we were of no use whatever to him.

Through the years I have seen over and over again where a triune god is active in the lives of believers through his defining, demonstrating and delivering to us the gift of salvation. Looking back I find that he stepped into my life when I needed Him and I did not know it at the time nor would I have accepted it. I find the impact shown here of the love of God in how different his motives are from ours. The one

certain outcome of our lives is death. Here we see the extent of the love of God and what it took for the father to turn his back on his son so that in his death and resurrection we find a gift offered to us of eternal life.

There is a hymn written by Frederick H. Lehman in 1917 titled "The Love Of God" sung by George Beverly Shea which includes the following words:

Could we with Ink the ocean fill, and were the skies of parchment made, were every stalk on earth a quill, And every man a scribe by trade

To write the love of God above would drain the ocean dry,

Nor could the scroll contain the whole, though stretched from sky to sky.

## Event In Freeman To Support Worldwide Relief

FREEMAN - People from communities scattered across southeast South Dakota and beyond will gather for a major daylong project to support worldwide relief projects titled "Sharing God's Gifts" on Saturday, July 25.

The South Dakota Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) Relief Sale will be held on the campus of Freeman Academy in Freeman. It will feature silent and live auctions and a variety of food booths and activities. All proceeds will go to Mennonite Central Committee, a global, nonprofit organization with support from Mennonite and Brethren in Christ congregations in North America. MCC strives to share God's love and compassion for all through relief, development and peace projects.

stewed beef, cheese pockets, sauerkraut, tamales, taco salad, fruit salad, spinach/ strawberry salad, concessions with sloppy joes and hot dogs, pie, kuchen, ice cream bars and snow cones

This is the 27th relief sale held in South Dakota, but this year it has a new home. After being held for 25 years in Sioux Falls — three years at the fairgrounds and 22 years at the Arena - the event known as Minn-Kota Festival took a two-year break to regroup and emerged as S.D. MCC Relief Sale in 2014. Wanting this to be a community event, the organizing committee chose the Freeman Community Center. But the event drew a crowd larger than expected and the facility was stretched to the limit.

After researching other options, the decision was made to hold it in Pioneer Hall on the Freeman Academy campus. This campus is well known for hosting the annual Schmeckfest activities each spring and is well suited for hosting the relief sale.

These 27 relief sales held in South Dakota have sent a grand total of nearly \$2.5 million to MCC for its work around the world.
