



WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks closed broadly lower Friday for the fourth day in a row. Weak quarterly results and outlooks from several companies weighed on the market. New signs pointing to a slowing of China's economy also added to investor jitters.

The Dow Jones industrial average lost 163.39 points, or 0.9 percent, to 17,568.53.

The Standard & Poor's 500 index fell 22.50 points, or 1.1 percent, to 2,079.65.

The Nasdaq composite shed 57.78 points, or 1.1 percent, to 5,088.63.

The Dow lost 517.92 points, or 2.9 percent.

The S&P 500 index fell 46.99 points, or 2.2 percent.

The Nasdaq fell 121.52 points, or 2.3 percent.

FOR THE YEAR:

The Dow is down 254.54 points, or 1.4 percent.

The S&P 500 index is up 20.75 points, or 1 percent.

The Nasdaq is up 352.57 points, or 7.4 percent.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were lower Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery was off 9.75 cents to \$5.1175 a bushel; December corn lost 12 cents at 4.0275 a bushel; December oats fell 6.50 cents at 2.4250 a bushel; while November soybeans declined 15.50 cents to \$9.65 a bushel.

Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. October live cattle was off .53 cent to \$1.4412 a pound; August feeder cattle was .10 cent lower to \$2.0967 a pound; while October lean hogs fell .68 cent to \$6.402 a pound.
