If passed, the hearing would be set for August 10.

Additionally, the city will also discuss payment of the newly acquired property on the Human Services Center campus, a proposed four-way stop at the intersection of 23rd St. and Green St., Commission travel and an executive session to discuss personnel matters.

The meeting is at 7 p.m. Monday in the City of Yankton Community Room of the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St.

USD Receives \$1.1 Million Grant

VERMILLION — The University of South Dakota received a \$1.1 million grant from the U.S. Education Department to support low-income, first-generation and students with disabilities with academic need.

The TRIO Student Support Services Program grant will help USD provide a variety of resources and services to 140 students each year over the next five years, including: free tutoring, personal and career counseling, mentoring, cultural enrichment programs, financial and economic literacy, and financial aid and scholarship assistance.

"The goal of the program is to increase recruitment, retention and graduation of qualified students," said Kimberly Grieve, vice president of student services and dean of students.

Grieve and Michael Suing, who works in student services, prepared the grant proposal that received a rare perfect score.

Applications for Fall 2015 classes will be taken in the next couple of weeks.

Rummage Sales Set Sign Requirements

If you're planning rummage or yard sale, the City of Yankton reminds you that signs may be posted on private property at the location of the sale only.

A good general rule is to keep signs to the inside (house side) of the public sidewalk or about 15 feet from the roadside curb if there is no sidewalk.

For the safety of all drivers and pedestrians signs cannot be posted in boulevards, attached to utility poles, street signs, street trees, light poles, or be placed in parks. Signs posted in the public right-of-way will be removed.
