eight games a year ago) and other key playmakers return-

ing from injuries themselves. Earl, however, went home to suburban Chicago to seek further treatment on his back, missing the rest of spring practices and the spring game. By the time he returned to Vermillion, the pain had intensified; so much so that he couldn't lift

weights.
"He was unable to lift or do any of that stuff," Glenn said. "I think we all understand that."

Now, with USD players set to report for fall camp next week, the offensive reins go to Saeger.

Stepping in for an injured Earl is not a new situation for Saeger, however.

The 6-foot-4 Heartland, Wisconsin, native started

four games last season after Earl suffered a broken thumb at Oregon. Saeger then guided the Coyotes to their only two wins of the season (William Penn and Northern Àrizona) and finished the season with 660 passing yards with three touchdowns and three interceptions. Having spent that kind of

time in game situations, coupled with his first-team reps during the spring, should help Saeger, according to Glenn. "He's doing a great job,

and our players, our coaches, we all have confidence in Ryan," Glenn said.

A large part of any success Saeger has will undoubtedly hinge on the health of his weapons, as was made clear Monday by Glenn. Running back Trevor Bouma (508 yards, 3 TD) suffered a broken arm last season, while wide receiver Brandt Van Roekel (13 rec., 167 yards, 1 TD) and tight

end Aaron Ramsey (12 rec., 221 yards) also missed time with injuries. With more time. Saeger

will improve in certain key areas, Glenn said. "He knows (Eric) Shuf-

ford is his prime target," the coach said. "He'll have to just be patient and read his plays out." With Earl not available at

all this season, the quarterback position behind Saeger has two other options: redshirt freshman Brian Woodward and high school recruit Austin Simmons. There may not be much

in the way of game depth at the quarterback spot, but at least the Coyotes have a guy in Saeger who looks the part, joked their coach.

"He's John Wayne. He looks good on a saddle," said Glenn, whose team opens the season Sept. 5 at Kansas State.

On a day when it was both celebrating its successes from 2014 and looking ahead to 2015, the Missouri Valley now has just as many teams with quarterback questions as it does teams with established quarterbacks.

The top two teams in the pre-season poll – North Dakota State and Illinois State, respectively – return proven weapons at quarterback, with Southern Illinois, Youngstown State and Southern Illinois also bring back experienced starters at that spot.

"That's a position that in this league you have to be great at," Southern Illinois coach Dale Lennon said. "Those guys have to find a way to win you a game here and there."

Lennon's Salukis will again be led by Mark Iannotti, while North Dakota State (Carson Wentz), Illinois State (Tre Roberson), Western Illinois (Trenton Norvell) and Youngstown State (Hunter Wells) are the other teams with no questions at quarterback heading into the 2015 season.

Western Illinois coach Bob Nielson said it best: "It's always great to have returning experience at quarter-

Oddly enough, the top

two teams in the Missouri Valley both had quarterbacks in their first seasons as starters last year. And North Dakota State and Illinois State would eventually meet each other in the FCS championship game – the first time two league teams played for the FCS title.

On the other side of the coin are five teams that will be looking for a No. 1 quarterback out of fall camp.

The University of South Dakota has, however, already found its starter. Junior Ryan Saeger will replace senior starter Kevin Earl, who will miss the season with a back injury, head coach Joe Glenn officially announced Monday.

Up the road in Brookings, South Dakota State likely already has its starter, in Zach Lujan, but offensive coordinator Eric Eidsness made clear Monday that Lujan will have some competition. Lujan guided the Jackrab-

bits to a 5-2 record in place of the injured Austin Sumner, who returned to lead SDSU to the playoffs. Lujan will be pushed by sophomore Dalton Douglas and freshman Taryn Christion. "I think the biggest thing

is, you know who your

playmakers are every year,"

said Eidsness, who was fill-

ing in for head coach John

Stiegelmeier. 'You plan ahead, but your offense does take on a slightly different flavor every year.

Northern Iowa, meanwhile, has four contenders for its quarterback position, according to head coach Mark Farley. The Panthers return senior Sawyer Kollmorgen, who has the most experience, but he will be pushed in fall camp by three teammates – the plan is cut that number in half by week two of fall camp, Farley said.

Your season is dictated a lot of times by your quarterback and the decision he makes," he said.

Missouri State and Indiana State are the two schools with truly no starting experience to choose from. Missouri State will have three options for first-year head coach Dave Steckel, while

Indiana State will have two options for Sanford.

# First Taste Of Bo Pelini

By far the most anticipated segment of Monday's coaches teleconference with the media was Bo Pelini.

The former Nebraska head coach was hired last December to rejuvenate Youngstown State, which was once an FCS powerhouse. The Penguins were 31-25 in five seasons under former coach Eric Wolford, but couldn't reach the FCS playoffs, despite coming close a number of times.

Pelini, meanwhile, inherits a 7-win team that was picked fourth in Monday's pre-season Valley poll.

"I like our football team on the surface coming back," Pelini said. "We really worked in the off-season to build some depth, and I think we've accomplished that."

By taking the job at Youngstown State, it's been a homecoming for Pelini, who was born in Youngstown and attended Ohio State University. "It's been nice for me and

my family to be able to come back home," he said Monday. "This will always be home for me." Plus, there was already

a foundation in place for success at Youngstown State; it wasn't as if he had to start from scratch.

"Get a chance to get the program back going again, to

try to compete for conference championships and national championships," Pelini said. "That's ultimately what our bench mark is here.' While Pelini was at Nebraska, his program had 85

scholarships. At Youngstown

State, it's 63, which told him

his first order of business

would be to develop depth in his new roster. 'You're not going to build depth without numbers," Pelini said. "We have more guys that are getting scholar-

ship money. "Let's face it; you're not going to hit on every guy you take. You'll have your misses. Everybody develops at a different rate.'
