Yankton Native Offered To Join Security Consulting Firm

The Daniel Morgan Academy Graduate School for National Security Studies in Washington D.C., has announced that Jon Hittle of the Yankton-Sioux City investigation and security consulting firm Executive Services Consultants will join its faculty as an Adjunct Instructor beginning in the Fall 2015 semester.

The Daniel Morgan Academy confers graduate degrees in National Security Studies as well as professional certificates in intelligence-related subjects.

Hittle received his MA degree from Louisiana State University and served as an intelligence officer for 32 years prior to entering the private sector in 2009. In addition to Washington D.C., he served in Southeast Asia, Central America, Europe, Eastern Europe and the Middle East and he is also a veteran of Operation Just Cause, Operations Desert Shield/Desert Storm, Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom. During the Gulf War he served as a senior liaison officer to General Norman Schwarzkopf's U.S. Central Command Joint Staff. He is an acknowledged expert in counter-terrorism, insurgency/counterinsurgency, weapons proliferation, counterintelligence, special operations and intelligence tradecraft. During his career he conducted numerous risk management programs abroad and led intelligence investigations of lethal terrorist attacks against U.S. citizens. He is also a veteran of the US Coast Guard, where he served as an intelligence specialist and Boarding Officer in Maritime Security Team (MST) operations.

He is the author of "Michael Collins and the Anglo-Irish War: Britain's Failed Counterinsurgency," published by Potomac Books/University of Nebraska Press as well as scholarly articles in defense and national security journals. He has served as a consultant and subject matter expert for the popular British TV program "Who Do You Think You Are?" in an episode investigating the October 1920 murder by British intelligence and police officers of an innocent Irish civilian that aired on BBC in 2014.

He is the recipient of the National Intelligence Medal of Achievement, the CIA Intelligence Medal of Merit, the CIA Iraq Campaign Medal, the CIA HUMINT Collector of the Year Award and the CIA Counter-proliferation Award for Excellence, the US Coast Guard Achievement Medal, the National Defense Service Medal and numerous professional citations.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were higher Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for September delivery was up .25 cent to \$4.9650 a bushel; December corn rose 5.50 cents at 3.8375 a bushel; December oats were 6.50 cents higher at 2.4650 a bushel; while November were gained 6.75 cents to \$9.50 a bushel.

Beef was lower and pork was unchanged on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. October live cattle was off .02 cent to \$1.4645 a pound; August feeder cattle fell .25 cent to \$2.1122 a pound; while October lean hogs were unchanged at \$6.607 a pound.

SD High Court Bars Citibank Recoup Of \$30M In Tax

PIERRE — Citibank will not be able to reclaim \$30 million in overpaid bank taxes to the state because it didn't request a refund until after the three-year legal window had passed, the South Dakota Supreme Court said in an opinion released on Thursday.

The high court upheld lower rulings and said that Citibank's efforts to reclaim the overpaid taxes were time-barred by state law. The court rejected the financial group's argument that it should be able to request the refund outside the time limit because it said state rules carve out a limited exception to the statute of limitations.

Republican state Sen. Deb Peters, chairwoman of the Senate Appropriations Committee, said lawmakers had discussions with legislative leaders and the governor's office about what would happen if the state lost the case.

"That's just less money for other things if we would have had to pay that back," Peters said. "It's less money for education and less money for Medicaid, so yeah, cutting those programs would have stunk, to be perfectly blunt about it."

A spokeswoman for Gov. Dennis Daugaard said in a written statement that "Citibank is an important corporate citizen and the Governor is glad to have this issue resolved."
