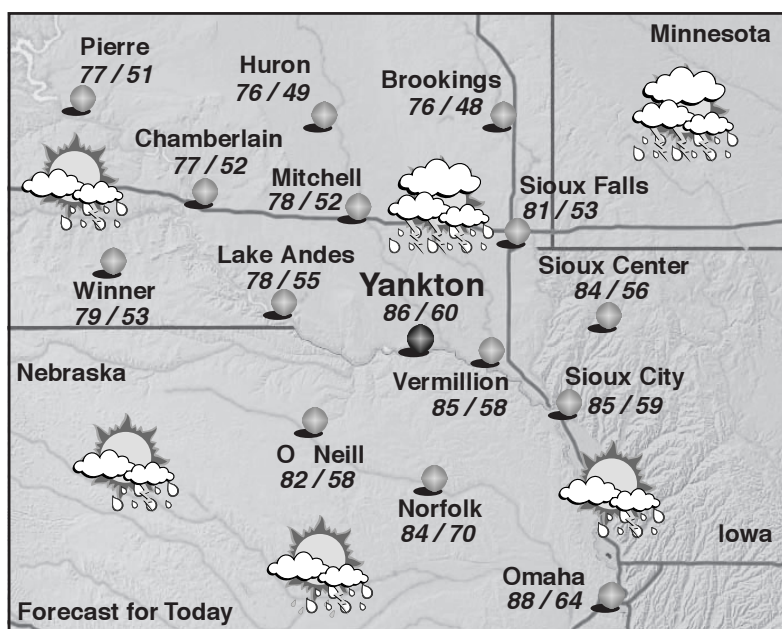

75 YEARS AGO
Saturday, June 1, 1935
 • Floods and tornadoes ripped through Nebraska today and meager reports which filtered from the devastated areas told of many deaths but they could not be confirmed. All communication lines to southwestern Nebraska were washed out, but an amateur radio station at McCook pierced a long veil of silence to announce 16 families were "wiped out" by a tornado which struck eight miles north of there.
 • Heavy rains which again drenched this section, and much of South Dakota yesterday and last night, brought Yankton's total precipitation so far this year to well over 14 inches, and put May's total above normal.

50 YEARS AGO
Wednesday, June 1, 1960
 • Bob Gregg's wife and four children watched as he crashed his pontoon plane into Lake Mitchell, and then came up laughing. The wife said the family watched as Bob's plane bounced twice on the lake and then nosed under. Then Gregg burst out of the water laughing and was immediately picked up nearby.
 • The role of NASA as a cover for U.S. espionage flights over the Soviet Union was studied today by a Senate committee.

Saturday, June 1, 1985
 • The Nebraska Department of Banking and Finance closed four banks Friday, citing problem farm loans at each.
 • A legislative committee gave South Dakota Gov. William Janklow approval Friday to go ahead with financing plans for five buildings at state-run colleges, including an \$8.9M physical education and classroom building at Northern State College.

should be 'Shut Up And Rock.' They want mainly music."

The station will feature a mix of local on-air talent and music, Becker said.

"We will have the morning show with Dave Bradbury, and then we will have some fun programming," she said. "Our focus group said they wanted to have music and be entertained. But they don't want anything too gimmicky."

The new station won't affect programming at KYNT and KK9A/KK93, Dykstra said.

"We are keeping our other radio stations the same," he said. "KYNT, our AM station, is more news and information with lighter music. KYNT is adult contemporary music, while KK93, our FM station, is country. This new station really complements what we already have in this building."

KDAM will also open up the local airwaves for more listening options, Becker said.

"On Friday nights, when a majority of stations are broadcasting football games, or other types of sporting events, we offer a music alternative," she said. "We're offering mainstream rock. We're not going soft rock or

easy listening."

KDAM will offer "newer" music, Dykstra said. "Then again, 'newer' is a relative term. It's amazing, but Kurt Cobain (lead singer, songwriter and guitarist of the Seattle rock band Nirvana) has been dead for 15 years," he said.

Riverfront Broadcasting is also working on its new media approach to KDAM, Dykstra said. The station could stream on-line music this summer, Dykstra said.

The FCC performed an engineering analysis last year, showing the capacity for a frequency in the Hartington area, Becker said.

"We did some researching and found we could put (a new station) on our towers, and we could use the same building," she said. "We could offer another FM station and serve the community with a different niche than was already being touched. We got (the new station) in the bidding process."

Riverfront Broadcasting is remodeling its Yankton building to make room for the new station, Becker said.

The station will use existing tower sites in Cedar County, Neb., now used for KK93, Dykstra said.

KDAM becomes the ninth radio station under the Beckers' ownership. They have purchased two stations each in Yankton, Pierre, Mitchell and Nebraska. However, KDAM

becomes the Beckers' first station started from the ground up.

"We are excited," Carolyn said. "It's funny, but when we bought our first station in 2004, in Nebraska City, my husband said his dream was to put a new station on the air. My husband works more with the engineering and computers, so this is his baby."

And yes, the Beckers chose the KDAM call letters on purpose.

"There aren't a lot of call letters available in the United States. We were looking for something that wasn't just South Dakota or Nebraska. We had a tough time finding those," Carolyn said. "Then my husband saw that those (KDAM) call letters were available and we thought of the (Gavins Point) connection."

The stations' local ownership has given it the flexibility to move in new directions, Dykstra said.

"We are not corporate. We can customize what we think is best for the Missouri Valley," he said. "I think it's unique. Here, we have local guys putting together a station based on what people want for our community."

KDAM will bring another dimension to an already vibrant Yankton broadcasting scene with six stations, Dykstra said.

"We are trying to give people another option," he said.
