incident, he said.

"We are sure (the burglaries of) the cars are definitely linked," he said. "They were all in the same general area, all unlocked cars and within a few blocks."

Last weekend's car and residential burglaries could be separate matters that happened to occur at the same time, Mabry said. "It's a big step to go from the cars to entering a house," he said.

Mabry urged local residents to lock their homes and vehicles at any time of the year.

"We live in a very safe community, but even the safest of communities still require the locking of doors," he said. "We like to think that it isn't necessary in our community. But in reality, it's necessary everywhere."

It's rare for Vermillion police

officers to investigate a burglary where entry was forced, Mabry said. The vast majority of the time, the vehicle or house is left unlocked, he said.

"Law enforcement refers to these incidents as crimes of opportunity," the police chief said. "Unfortunately, we create the opportunity when we fail to lock our doors."

A nighttime burglar likely wouldn't be as noticeable in Vermillion this time of year, Mabry said.

"In this town, it's not unusual for people to be walking around at all hours during the summer time," he said.

Mabry asks that people help prevent crime by taking a few simple precautions.

"It takes a community effort," he said. "The ironic thing, a few times when the house is broken into or a car is broken into, typically we make an arrest because the thief usually leaves evidence."
