New Stadium Planned In Alexandria

ALEXANDRIA (AP) — Fans of the Hanson High School football team in Alexandria are getting some new digs. School officials are building a 600-seat stadium with a concession stand, press box, bathrooms and storage areas. Construction is expected to start in mid-June and wrap up before the first game in the fall.

School Board President Curt Hart estimates the cost at between \$250,000 and \$300,000. Donations are expected to cover about half.
