### Yankton Co. Sheriff Warns Of Telephone Scam

The Yankton County Sheriff's Office is warning residents of a telephone scam experienced by local citizens. In a media release, Sheriff Dave Hunhoff states that potential victims are contacted via telephone by a voice claiming to be their grandchild, or a voice claiming to be calling on behalf of a grandchild. At times, the caller will claim to be an attorney calling on behalf of a grandchild. The caller will tell the victim that their grandchild is in trouble in another country, and in some cases knows the name of the grandchild. A request is made for cash to be sent to a location, usually outside of the United States, by money-gram. Often, details are given as to where to go in Yankton to send the money-gram. Persons asked to send money in these or similar situations should be very skeptical and demand specific information to allow them to independently verify the facts before sending money. Local law enforcement will assist in verifying information if asked. If called by someone claiming to be a family member, it is a good idea to ask questions of the caller that could only be answered correctly by the family member. It's also a good idea to get a call-back number.
