GRAINS FUTURES TRADE MIXED ON THE CHICAGO BOT

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures were mixed early Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for July delivery rose 1.5 cents to \$4.44 a bushel, while July corn slipped 0.25 cent to \$3.4825 a bushel and soybeans for July delivery jumped 8.75 cents to \$9.4125 a bushel. July oats were unchanged at \$1.92 a bushel.

Meanwhile, beef futures traded higher and pork futures fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle edged up 0.22 cent to 92.27 cents a pound; August feeder cattle added 0.2 cent to \$1.0985 a pound; June lean hogs shed 0.02 cent to 81.3 cents a pound; and July pork bellies lost 2.45 cents to \$1.0005 a pound.
