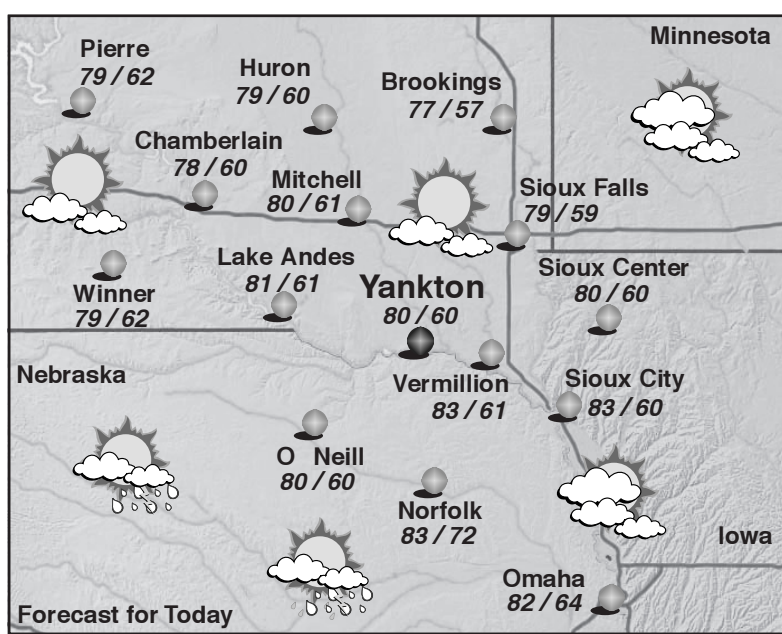

 Meanwhile, beef futures traded higher and pork futures fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
 June live cattle inched up 0.15 cent to 89.95 cents a pound; August feeder cattle gained 0.45 cent to \$1.0885 a pound; June lean hogs slipped 0.15 cent to 77.62 cents a pound; and July pork bellies lost 3 cents to 94.8 cents a pound.

She added that residents don't need to worry about their own numbers or added costs resulting from the change.
 "Your current telephone number and area code will not change. It's still going to be considered a local call," she said.
 Additionally, customers will be required to dial only seven digits for local calls within the South Dakota 605 area code. Three-digit numbers such as

411, 711 and 911 will remain unchanged, as well.
 Customers have been informed eight months in advance so they won't get caught off-guard by the change, Smith said.
 "One of the reasons that the Public Service Commission has made the announcement now is so that businesses can change their Web sites, their stationery, their ad materials, and so individuals can make sure that they have 10-digit dialing into their automated pre-programmed numbers," she said.
 The change shouldn't be difficult for most people, as 10-digit dialing is becoming "more

of a standard," she added.
 "The way it is these days, somebody with a cell phone number tied to a billing address could have an area code from anywhere," Smith said.
 "Someone with a 402 area code could be going to college anywhere in the country and still be using that number."

Residents should be receiving further information about the change from their respective telephone companies, Smith said.
