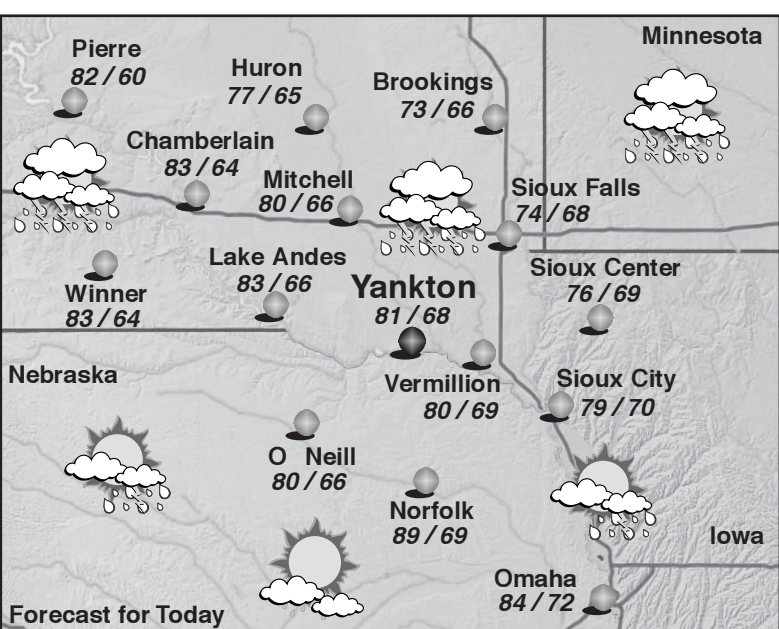

28-Year-Old Arrested After Crash, Fleeing Police Officer

A 28-year-old man collided with a semi in downtown Yankton Tuesday night as he attempted to flee from police in his Ford Escort. Jeremy Langley, 28, was subsequently arrested on suspicion of driving under the influence (third). According to Yankton Police Chief Brian Paulsen, the pursuit began near the intersection of Seventh and Pine streets. "The officer on patrol heard a vehicle squealing its tires and went toward it to investigate," he said. "The vehicle began to flee, got to Fourth and Capitol and collided with the semi." The Escort was totaled in the collision, Paulsen stated. The driver was taken to the hospital for a blood test but was not injured. The passenger in the Escort refused immediate medical attention but later went to the hospital with a fractured shoulder. Paulsen said the driver of the semi was not injured in the accident.

Applications Being Accepted For S.D. Tax Refund Program

PIERRE — Applications are being accepted for a state program that provides once-a-year refunds of sales or property taxes to eligible senior citizens and disabled individuals in South Dakota. Under the Sales and Property Tax Refund for Senior and Disabled Citizens, qualified applicants will receive refunds of sales or property taxes based on their income. Refund checks are issued beginning at the end of August. The program is funded through an annual appropriation from the South Dakota Legislature. To be eligible for refunds, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Be at least 66 years old on or before Jan. 1 of the current year OR be disabled during any part of the year. "Disabled" is defined as being qualified to receive Social Security Disability benefits, Supplemental Security Disability benefits, or the individual is a veteran with a rated disability of 60 percent or higher.
- Must have been a South Dakota resident for the entire previous year.
- Must meet annual income requirements. The 2009 income limit for a single-member household was \$10,250; the limit for a multiple-member household was \$13,250.

Applications for the program are available from the Department of Revenue and Regulation's Property and Special Taxes Division or can be downloaded from the Department's website at <http://www.state.sd.us/drr2/form/s/propertytaxforms.htm>. Applications will be accepted through July 1. For more information, call the Department's toll-free helpline at 1-800-829-9188 and ask for the Division of Property and Special Taxes.

Monday, June 10, 1935
 Chinese troops were reported in Japanese news dispatches today to have started their evacuation of North China, signaling what the messages described as China's complete surrender to the demands of Japanese military authorities.
 The starting date of the National Geographic-army stratosphere flight from the Black Hills again was indefinite today. Weather conditions appeared unfaithful, with the inflation of the huge balloon today appearing unlikely.

Friday, June 10, 1960
 A complete 200-bed prepositioned civil defense hospital, in 364 cases and crates, was trucked into Yankton this morning from the civil defense central warehouse at Seneca, Ill., and unloaded for possible emergency use.
 If Uncle Sam had to liquidate his stock of farm surpluses at today's prices he would take quite a loss. An agriculture department report showed the agency had \$7,358,234,000 invested in surpluses as of June 30. But commodities had a book value based on the existing market prices — only \$4,433,919,000.

 Yankton firefighters will come home winners following victories in both the men's and women's divisions at the state fire school held last Thursday through Sunday in Belle Fourche.

Wheat for July delivery fell 4.25 cents to \$4.28 a bushel, while July corn rose 1 cent to \$3.3825 a bushel and oats for July delivery climbed 7.75 cents to \$2.04 a bushel. July soybeans jumped 12.5 cents to \$9.435 a bushel. Meanwhile, beef and pork futures also traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. June live cattle lost 0.3 cent to 89.65 cents a pound; August feeder cattle added 0.37 cent to \$1.0922 a pound; June lean hogs slipped 0.17 cent to 77.45 cents a pound; and July pork bellies gained 1.7 cents to 96.5 cents a pound.
