citizens. We got the ball rolling."

The project seeks to raise \$125,000 and is partnering with the Scotland Economic Development Corporation. The effort has secured the \$40,000 thus far from private donors and from events such as a Belgian waffle feed. Another program uses a card accepted by area merchants, with a portion of the sales going back to the track project.

This Saturday, a fun-run walk entitled the "Lake Henry Hustle" will begin and end at the picnic shelter on the lake's north side. Registration runs from 8-8:45 a.m. The 10K run starts at 8:50 a.m., with other events to follow. The event goes on, rain or shine, with the \$20 non-refundable registration going toward the track restoration.

"To raise \$40,000 in a really brief period of time has been amazing. And they raised the money when last year's hail damage was pretty bad and the economy was weak," Pepper said. "It does show interest in the community and school."

At its March meeting, the school board gave its approval for the project, Alvey said. "Once the board saw good support from the community, they gave their blessing and moved forward with the project," he said. "We are committed to the project regardless of how much more money is raised."

Alvey emphasized the track project will use capital-outlay funds, designated for construction and other major needs. The project will not use general funds, including the \$350,000 opt-out, that goes towards academics and staffing.

Fisher Construction of Boone,

Iowa, oversees the project, Alvey said. School employees and area volunteers have also helped move the project along, he said.

"We have done the demolition of some of the curb and gutter," he said. "We are working on the new high jump pit, and next week we hope to work on the long jump runway and long jump pit. Then we are hoping to start drainage, to make sure the water gets away from the track properly."

By later this month, crews hope to lay 12 to 18 inches of rock on top of the existing cinder. After creating the base, crews will lay 4 inches of asphalt on top, pack it down and let it cure for 30 days. During late July or early August, the track will be sprayed with a rubberized surface.

"By the time of the first football game, we hope to have the track striped and lined," Alvey said.

Scotland has excelled in track during the past decade, with the boys winning the state title and the girls placing high in the state meet.

"I can't even imagine what all those kids would have done if they had an all-weather track for practice," he said. "A lot of those kids, when they heard we were doing this (all-weather) track, were really supportive."

Now, tracksters won't need to run in the streets or resort to the gym when the track is unusable, Pepper said. The all-weather track will require little maintenance for years, he said. In addition, the consistent surface will benefit both athletics performances and safety, he said.

Scotland will no longer need to use neighboring schools' tracks when preparing for major meets, Pepper said. Quite the opposite, Scotland now has a certified track that can host high school meets and quality athletes for state, he said.

Scotland officials are already

working on scheduling home meets during the next school year, Pepper said. Scotland will continue hosting its junior high meet and will seek to host its own high school meet.

"The state has changed the rules," he said. "You used to need eight teams for a sanctioned (high school) meet, and now you can have four. We can start the first year with a smaller meet."

Scotland also hopes to get into the rotation for hosting one of its three conference meets, Pepper said. The Highlanders compete in the Little Missouri Valley Conference (LMVC), the Southeastern South Dakota (SESD) Conference and the Great Plains Conference.

"We think we can get to host a conference meet this year or next year," he said. "A lot of times, the schools with the newest tracks get placed early in the rotation."

Scotland officials have also set their sights on hosting the region meet — a far cry from recent years when they discontinued their own high school meet.

"I would think we have a good chance (for hosting a region)," Pepper said. "We have a new track with a good surface, that should be attractive and bring out the best in kids."

The track will benefit the community at large, Pepper said. School business manager Mitchell Brooks has talked of starting a Hershey track meet for younger residents. For adults, the track offers a safe and convenient walking area, with some residents showing interest in sprints and workouts, he said.

The new track represents a transition, Alvey said.

"At our junior high meet this spring, we stopped and talked about the fact that the kids were running the final meet on one of the last cinder track in the state," he said.

"Now, we are moving to the next phase of an all-weather

track. We are planning a dedication or some kind of recognition event, either at a football game this fall or at a track meet next spring."

The new track has inspired some former residents to donate to the project, Alvey said.

"Some alumni have written back and sent a check, telling us great job and thanking us for doing it," he said. "Others have called back and said they will send more money when the project is under way."

Pepper called the track a source of community pride that will benefit residents' health while providing enjoyment.

He also admits his own feelings of pride at seeing the project come to fruition.

"I am excited. I was out there today (at the track), and I got chills," he said. "There is definitely satisfaction after 38 years of coaching track and teaching at Scotland."
