S.D. Expands Search For Chronic Wasting Disease

SIoux FALLS — The state's search for fatal chronic wasting disease will be expanded into northwest South Dakota this fall after an infected mule deer was found just across the border. It's the first confirmed case of CWD in North Dakota. In South Dakota, 139 infected elk and deer have been found in three southwest counties in the past 13 years. Research continues nationwide on a mystery disease that attacks the brain of infected animals and has been found in 13 states and Canada.

Lab tests confirmed CWD in a deer killed by a hunter last fall in North Dakota's Sioux County on land within the Standing Rock Sioux Reservation, which straddles the two states.

Wildlife managers for the states and tribe will look for more cases by testing samples taken from deer heads provided by hunters in November. Lymph nodes are removed from the animal and tested in a lab.

"We're going to pull as many samples as we can and see where this disease is," said Steve Griffin, a wildlife biologist for the GF&P in Rapid City.

"I'm hoping to get at least 500 (samples) among the three agencies, but that's just a shot in the dark."

Since 1997, South Dakota's GF&P has tested 21,438 animals — mostly from hunter-provided deer and elk in Fall River, Custer and Pennington counties.

In North Dakota, the single confirmed CWD case came from about

16,000 samples of deer, elk and moose tested since 2002, said Dan Grove, the state's wildlife veterinarian.

North Dakota annually tests hunter-donated deer heads in a rotational system that this year targets the eastern third of the state. The Sioux County-area surveillance will be extra and comes in a hunting unit with 3,600-4,000 licenses.

"We figure about 3 to 5 percent of what hunters actually harvest is available for testing," Grove said Thursday.

"Hopefully we can increase that down in that area by making people aware that we are collecting, that there is a more specific need because we have found a positive."

The Standing Rock Sioux Tribe has met with wildlife agencies from both states and will cooperate in collecting deer samples, said Barry Betts, a wildlife biologist under contract with the tribe.

Within days of the CWD confirmation, the tribe killed deer in the immediate area and found no additional infections in 16 samples that were tested, he said.

Infected animals lose weight and muscle control and eventually die. The disease can't be diagnosed using physical symptoms because many big-game diseases affect animals in similar ways, according to the GF&P.

Officials say there is no evidence that CWD can be transmitted to humans or animals other than deer, elk and moose. But hunters are advised not to handle or eat wild animals that appear sick and to take other precautions when handling or transporting deer or elk carcasses.

Deadwood Shooting Suspect Pleads Insanity

DEADWOOD (AP) — A Deadwood man accused in a shooting that injured two of his neighbors has changed his plea to not guilty by reason of insanity.

Terry Willis previously pleaded not guilty — but not with an insanity clause — to attempted first-degree murder, as well as alternative charges of attempted murder, aggravated assault and commission of a felony with a firearm.

Willis is accused of shooting Terry Steinbach and his adult son, Monte, on Feb. 12. Terry Steinbach was shot in the wrist and his son in the abdomen.

Rescue Signal Tracked To Aircraft, No Crash

SIoux FALLS (AP) — Civil Air Patrol crews from South Dakota and Nebraska have located an aircraft emitting an emergency signal.

But, the South Dakota CAP wing says, there was no crash or injuries to prompt the rescue alert.

The signal that first went out early Friday evening was coming from an aircraft owned by a Murdo pilot. The South Dakota CAP wing says the source of the signal was located about 5 p.m. Saturday, and the pilot was contacted to shut it off.

The South Dakota CAP wing says prior to locating the source, air crews had anticipated searching for a downed aircraft between Rapid City and Ainsworth, Neb. Severe thunderstorms delayed the search, and crews on the ground worked to pinpoint the signal's location.

Sioux Falls Receives Environmental Award

SIoux FALLS (AP) — The city of Sioux Falls has received a national environmental award.

After presenting a synopsis of its sustainable services to the National Environmental Health Association, Sioux Falls was recognized with a 2010 National Environmental Health Association Excellence in Sustainability Award.

City officials say Sioux Falls over the past year and a half has addressed such areas as climate change, environmental justice, energy independence, natural resource conservation, unemployment, poverty and public health.

Old Aberdeen Central Buildings Up For Grabs

ABERDEEN (AP) — The city of Aberdeen is seeking proposals for two buildings on the old Central High School complex.

The Roosevelt and Washington buildings have been vacant for about five years, although blood research company IKOR occupied a portion of the Roosevelt building for a few years.

The city bought the buildings, surrounding parking lots and park for \$1 million after the high school moved to a new building on the south side of town.

Part of the complex is used for the city's parks and recreation department. The rest is empty.

Aberdeen City Attorney Adam Altman says the city is not looking to make money as much as putting the property put to greater use.

The city is seeking proposals for either a purchase or a long-term lease of the complex.

Neb. Parks On List Of Best Family Camps

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — ReserveAmerica says three of the nation's top 100 family campgrounds are in Nebraska.

Eugene T. Mahoney, Fort Robinson and Ponca state parks are ranked third, seventh and 25th, respectively, on the annual list.

ReserveAmerica is a recreation reservation service and handles Nebraska park reservations through the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission website, OutdoorNebraska.org.

ReserveAmerica also listed Lake McCaughy State Recreation Area as the No. 1 fishing spot.

Fort Robinson State Park ranked No. 3 on the list of kid-friendly parks.

The parks commission says the top 100 family campgrounds list was based on testimonials, campground ratings and feedback from campers, park rangers and regional park managers.
