But the regional employment picture has improved since hitting bottom last December, they wrote. While it was down 1 percent in April compared with last year, it had been down 4 percent back in December. They project employment at the end of 2010 will be up from the end of 2009.

"However the pace of hiring will hardly seem like a flood, but certainly more than a trickle," they wrote.

Employment levels probably won't reach prerecession peaks until 2013 or later, except in North Dakota, where they expect a return to peak levels by 2011 due to expanded oil drilling and the relatively healthy farm sector, the report said.

One of Lofthus' greatest moments came when he became the student. He attended a 1998 seminar for professors at the C-SPAN eadquarters in Washington D.C. He learned new ways of using the cable public-affairs network in the classroom. The C-SPAN seminar fueled

Lofthus' effort to make history come alive for students. He uses a variety of media, including documentary films. "I am a digital immigrant," he said. "I didn't grow up with

Going back to the Vietnam War example, Lofthus said he uses YouTube to show CBS News anchor Walter Cronkite's "We are Mired In Stalemate" broadcast in February 1968. Cronkite made the broadcast after visiting Southeast Asia following the Tet offensive. Many historians sav Cronkite's broadcast turned popular opinion

against the war. Lofthus has been quick to use such technology, said Bob Tereshinski, MMC interim vice president and interim dean of

academic affairs. "Rich is really well organized and receptive to changing techniques," Tereshinski said. "He really controls the moment when it comes to his tory. When Rich closes the doors and starts class, he is really passionate about everything he presents.

However, Lofthus finds it difficult to convince others about the importance of

learning about the past. "The world we live in is so much barraged by entertainment and operates at a very superficial level." he said. "Much of it has to do with the impact of the Internet and the way in which we read.'

Lofthus cited an article comparing Internet use to jet skiing, where the reader skims the surface and jumps quickly from one spot to another. "But if you want to under-Lofthus said.

Lofthus handles well the rigors of the job, Tereshinski

"Rich is very dependable. He is a one-man department, and it takes a lot to do that. Tereshinski said. "You look at him teaching courses to 100 and 120 freshmen, and then to about a dozen history majors

on top of it. Lofthus has shown a knack for connecting with others,

Tereshinski said. "When Rich was selected for his award, we looked at his teaching activities and his interaction with students, inside and outside the classroom," he said. "We looked at how versatile the person was in the mastery of his subject matter. Rich was exceptional

when we looked at that." In addition to teaching, Lofthus serves as MMC's faculty athletic representative (FAR). In that role, he monitors the academic eligibility of more than 150 athletes. This year, he serves as FAR president for the Great Plains

Athletic Conference (GPAC). Lofthus notes with pride the Lancers' three consecutive years of winning the "Christopherson Award." The honor recognizes the highest cumulative grade-point average (GPA) among athletes at GPAC schools.

"It was significant that we had a lot of student-athletes who were serious about their academic pursuits," he said. We had several members of the women's basketball team who went into medical fields and earned a 4.0 GPA."

The Christopherson Award has become a highly competitive and coveted honor.

we had no way of comparing ourselves with other schools he said. "We believed we had a good balance of academics and athletics, but the award validated the approach we have been taking for several

Lofthus' ties to the athletic department are nothing new. Tereshinski recalled his years of coaching Lancer baseball when Lofthus volunteered to keep statistics for free.

Lofthus also contributes to the athletic department in another way: photographing Lancer events. His camera skills have taken on another dimension, as he displays his work at galleries. As if he isn't busy enough, Lofthus and other faculty take students to Europe during Christmas break. He incorporates information from the trips into his history courses.

on campus for adults. "We revived the tradition here, and it has been very successful." he said. "This year, we combined it with theater when the National Players came to campus. One of the most popular presentations was (Black Hills photographer) Paul Horsted.'

Tereshinski isn't surprised at Lofthus' long list of accomplishments, comparing him to a franchise baseball player.

"Rich is a guy with many interests. He's really like the hitter who clears off the bases, or he's the closer in pitching," Tereshinski said. That's why we have a teacher of the year. A lot of our faculty are just like him. At a smaller liberal arts college, you produce success with people like Rich Lofthus.

In turn, Lofthus considers his more than two decades at MMC as rewarding in many

"The best thing is working with students all these years he said. "I want them to be people who live their lives based on the values that have been emphasized while they were here.
