**NOTICE OF APPLICATION NO. 7200-3 to Appropriate Water**

Notice is given that RC Investments LLC, c/o Randy Golden, 144 Scenic Drive, Yankton, SD 57078 has filed an application for a water permit to appropriate 0.22 cubic feet of water per second (25 acre-feet annually) from one well completed into the Missouri:Elk Point Aquifer (79 feet deep) located in SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 15-T93N-R56W for commercial use at a greenhouse facility.

Pursuant to SDCL 46-2A-2, the Chief Engineer recommends APPROVAL of Application No. 7200-3 because 1) unappropriated water is available, 2) existing rights will not be unlawfully impaired, 3) it is a beneficial use of water, and 4) it is in the public interest. In accordance with SDCL 46-2A-23, the Chief Engineer will act on this application, as recommended, unless a petition is filed opposing the application or the applicant files a petition contesting the Chief Engineer's recommendation. If a petition opposing the application or contesting the recommendation is filed, then a hearing will be scheduled and the Water Management Board will consider this application. Notice of the hearing will be given to the applicant and any person filing a petition.

Any person interested in opposing or supporting this application or recommendation must file a written petition with BOTH the applicant and Chief Engineer. The applicant must file a petition if contesting the Chief Engineer's recommendation. The Chief Engineer's address is "Water Rights Program, Foss Building, 523 E Capitol, Pierre SD 57501 (605 773-3352)" and the applicant's mailing address is given above. A petition filed by either an interested person or the applicant must be filed by July 5, 2010.

The petition may be informal, but must include a statement describing the petitioner's interest in the application, the petitioner's reasons for opposing or supporting the application, and the signature and mailing address of the petitioner or the petitioner's legal

Newsum, the First Amendment Center and the Diversity Institute. He was chairman of the Freedom Forum from 1986 to 1997, and was a trustee of the foundation and its predecessor, the Gannett Foundation, from 1965 to 1999. Neuharth is founder of the nation's most widely read newspaper, USA TODAY, and former chairman and chief executive officer of the Gannett Co.

In response to an inquiry from an AJJI participant, Neuharth said he hopes the government never becomes financially involved in the news business, even though the industry has suffered in recent years because of the recession.

"I hope I don't live long enough to see that, and that you don't either," Neuharth said. "If the government got involved in funding or in any other financial aspect of newspapering, it would really be a problem. There would be no question that you would have those idiots on Capitol Hill telling you how to run them, and what news to publish in them."

"I think journalists, men or women, news-oriented or business-oriented, are much more likely to make financial success out of the news business than any politician would," he said.

Neuharth no longer describes himself as a "newspaper person," even though he is known as a pioneer in that field.

"I believe that any journalist cannot be really successful if he or she thinks of himself or herself as a newspaper person, because that's not what journalism is anymore," he said. "Journalism is the news and information business, and there are so many people who want their news and other information in any number of ways."

There's been some bad news regarding newspapers and journalism in recent months, as newsrooms cut staff and several well-known national newspapers have closed their doors.

That trend has done nothing to change Neuharth's optimistic outlook about the craft of journalism.

"People are more hungry for news and advertising and entertainment than they have ever been. It's not going to be just print, and it may not be predominantly print, but the news and information business, delivered in ways that the consumers want it, has the greatest future that it has ever had in my lifetime."

In far western Nebraska, sandbags were being stockpiled in case the rising North Platte and South Platte rivers posed serious threats. Heavy snow melt, rains and large releases of water from bulging reservoirs, mainly in Wyoming, have made the Platte system a concern.

Overnight Thursday, the South Platte near Big Springs rose 7 feet and was within one-third mile of the town, said Jim Collins, emergency management director for Deuel and Garden Counties. Collins said he was not concerned the town would be flooded and was more worried about bridges in the area.

Officials were still trying Friday to figure out how much damage had already been done. Preliminary estimates could be made the middle of next week, they said.

Joe Boyd with the Federal Emergency Management Agency said Friday residents have told his workers they are mostly worried about roads and bridges.

In interviews, emergency management officials across the state have butted heads, pointing to just a handful of homes possibly destroyed in towns hit hardest by the flood, including Schuyler, Clearwater, and North Loup.

Although roughly 380 homes and businesses were damaged in recent days in those towns, most just had flooded basements.

Norfolk is the largest city to experience flooding so far, but officials haven't estimated how many homes and businesses may have been damaged there. The destruction was believed to be mostly confined to an industrial area and small residential areas in the southern part of the city.
