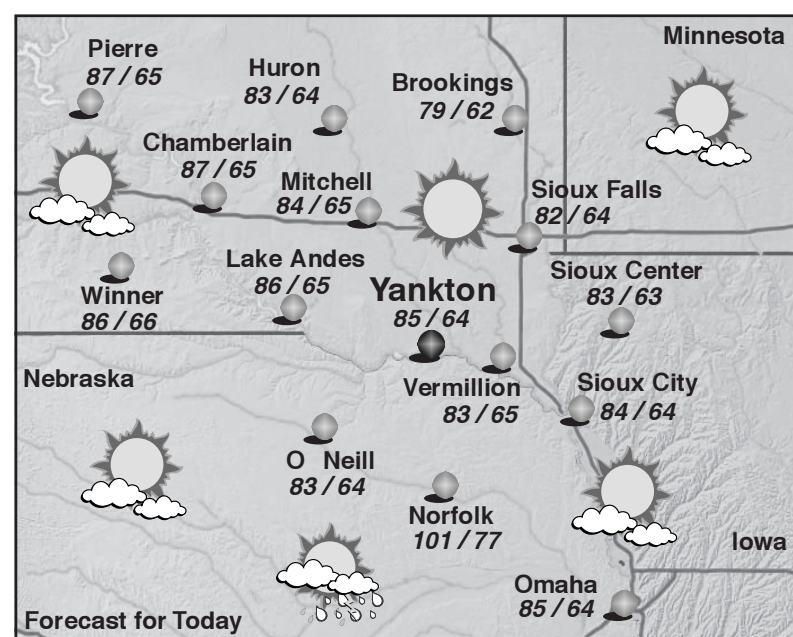

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures were mostly lower Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
 Soybeans for November delivery slid 12.5 cents to \$9.235 a bushel, while September corn dropped 5.5 cents to \$3.555 a bushel and oats for July delivery lost 3 cents to \$2.75 a bushel. September wheat was unchanged at \$4.7575 a bushel.
 Meanwhile, beef futures traded mixed and pork futures fell on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
 August live cattle slipped 0.3 cent to 88.5 cents a pound; August feeder cattle inched up 0.08 cent to \$1.119 a pound; August lean hogs shed 0.28 cent to 84.22 cents a pound; and July pork bellies fell 0.48 cent to 99.97 cents a pound.
