"At ALLI, I work with Native students to help them tell their own stories. They are being prepared to go out into the mainstream newsroom, but some are going back to their tribes," she said.

"I love seeing young Natives catch fire and find the means to achieve their dreams. It's affecting the coverage of Native issues that are important to them. Their work helps people understand the issues."

American Indian journalism students have traditionally found limited markets for their work and publications, Hoepfner said. Now, technology has opened new opportunities for blogging, video and other media, she said.

"It has given a voice to people who never had a voice," she said. "As they harness new media, I expect to see more good reporting to come out of the reservations and all over the world."

Hoepfner pointed to the strides made by Ramona Marozas, a 20-year-old college student and a Chippewa with the Bad

River Tribe of Wisconsin.

"Ramona came to Crazy Horse from Minnesota for a conference," Hoepfner said. "She was turned on to journalism, and now she's going to college for it."

Marozas said she finds Hoepfner serving as a role model.

"I am going into TV journalism. I have already learned more from Val during the last two weeks than I did in a whole year at school," Marozas said. "Val puts people at ease. You feel comfortable and at home. I think Val has inspired me to continue with my multi-media career. To be able to see a successful female Native American in journalism is such an inspiration."

Fellow ALLI student Elyse Watkins agreed. "Val definitely knows what she is doing. She covers a lot of ground in a short period of time," she said.

Hoepfner holds a bachelor's degree from Truman State University in Kirksville, Mo. Through her internship with Stauffer Communications, she learned of a photography opening at the *Press & Dakotan*.

She may have been looking for a paycheck, but Hoepfner said she also found a tremendous learning experience at Yankton.

"My time at the *P&D* was a great experience," she said. "I learned a little bit of everything. I didn't do a lot of writing at

the time, but I covered so many things. I learned so much about community journalism."

In that respect, Hoepfner echoed the words of *USA Today* and Freedom Forum founder Al Neuharth. During last week's campus visit, Neuharth — a USD graduate — advised ALLI students not to overlook any opportunity.

"Al Neuharth said, 'Don't be in too big a hurry,'" Hoepfner said. "I started at the *P&D*, and I got to do so much and have so much fun. And look where I ended up."

After her start at the *P&D*, Hoepfner freelanced and worked as photographer and photo editor at the *Argus Leader* in Sioux Falls. After 10 years there, she moved to the *Indianapolis Star*, another Gannett Co. newspaper.

As she moved up the ladder, Hoepfner found many of the same principles applied whether she worked in Yankton or a metro area like Indianapolis.

"You learn about becoming part of the fabric of the community and telling the story," she said. "We did a lot of positive stories (at the *P&D*) because a lot of good stuff went on in Yankton and the area."

Hoepfner admits her career has benefited from a combination of good timing and good luck. She has stayed on top of technology and has ridden the wave of

the industry.

Jack Marsh, former editor at the *Argus Leader*, hired Hoepfner at the Sioux Falls newspaper. He now serves as the vice president for Freedom Forum diversity programs, offering her the newly-created multi-media position.

"Val is one of a handful of true experts in multi-media journalism. She is talented and a gifted teacher," Marsh said.

Hoepfner has earned a national reputation, Marsh said. She is as comfortable teaching college professors as she is working with young journalists, he said.

"She truly cares about her students. She stays in daily contact with scores of young people," he said.

Hoepfner remains a forward thinker, Marsh said. "I am confident that Val Hoepfner will stay current and relevant, even in ways she hasn't conceived yet," he said.

Hoepfner works at the John Seigenthaler Center in Nashville, named after the award-winning journalist and civil rights worker. He founded the Freedom Forum First Amendment Center in 1991.

Seigenthaler gave presentations on the USD campus this week. He commended Hoepfner's work at the Nashville center, saying she has lit a fire in the upcoming

generation in journalism.

"My perception is that there is a loss of sense of commitment, dedication and enjoyment of the business of journalism," he said. "But if you watch her at work, the journalists she is teaching, suddenly you are feeling that the spirit is there. There is a sense of enjoyment that the students experience and that she experiences."

Hoepfner uses self-deprecating wit, talking about her own past mistakes, to put her classes at ease while offering critiques of their work, Seigenthaler said. She brings the same enjoyment to journalism educators who may be reluctant to try new technology, he said.

"She combines old values with new journalism," he said. "Without her and people like her, the industry and journalism business would be a lot poorer and slower to get with it."

After sitting through her classes, Seigenthaler said he doesn't worry about future generations of journalists.

"Leadership is an intangible thing. You know it when you see someone has got it," he said of Hoepfner. "I will be 83 in another month. It's exciting to watch her and see very young journalists and student journalists learn from her. You want to be part of it."
