## DHHS Provides Fans To Help Neb. Cool Down

LINCOLN, Neb. — Fans are now available to low-income, aged or disabled people and families in several communities in southeast Nebraska. The Low Income Energy Assistance Program in the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) purchased the fans.

"Getting a fan is a small thing, but it can make such a difference in someone's life," said Jeff Schmidt, Southeast Service Area administrator with DHHS.

DHHS partners with local

organizations to help get the fans to the people who need them and is getting positive feedback on the value of the program.

Curt Krueger with Catholic Social Services in Lincoln said, "I can't thank DHHS enough for again allowing us to participate in this program. The people we have given fans to in the past are so very appreciative. I'm only sorry that you don't get to experience the fun of giving the fans away personally. This is a fantas-

tic program and I hope it continues in the future."

In addition to the fan distribution program, there is help for low-income individuals and families through the cooling program. To be eligible for the cooling program, someone in the household must be age 70 or older or have some specific medical conditions that make that person susceptible to heat. Applications can be requested online at <http://www.ACCESSNebraska.gov> or by calling any local DHHS office.

The household (HH) resource limit for the cooling program is \$5,000 and annual income limits are: household size 1, \$13,545; HH size 2, \$18,225; HH size 3, \$22,890; HH size 4, \$27,570; HH size 5, \$32,250; HH size 6, \$36,915; HH size 7, \$41,595; HH size 8, \$46,275; HH size 9, \$50,940; HH size 10, \$55,620; +\$4,680 for each additional member.

## Amputee Coalition Of America Urges Caution Using Fireworks This Fourth of July Holiday

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — The Amputee Coalition of America urges families to make sure their children are properly supervised and all instructions followed when using fireworks this Fourth of July. According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in 2008, U.S. hospital emergency rooms treated an estimated 7,000 people for fireworks-related injuries. These injuries most often involve hands, fingers, eyes and legs.

"After every July 4, we hear the news reports about people losing fingers and portions of their hands to fireworks accidents," said ACA president & CEO Kendra Calhoun.

"Fireworks are a traditional part of America's celebration of Independence Day, but we want families to have fun this Fourth of July, and having fun means they avoid an unnecessary trip to the hospital emergency room. Legal consumer fireworks

that comply with Consumer Product Safety Commission regulations can be relatively safe, but all fireworks are hazardous and can cause injury if proper safety measures are not followed. Even sparklers can cause serious burn injuries."

According to the Amputee Coalition, the best way to prevent losing a finger or part of your hand to a fireworks-related injury is to leave fireworks displays to the trained professionals.

But for those who participate, the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission and the National Council on Fireworks Safety have issued these tips:

- Do not let children under 14 use fireworks.
- Supervise individuals under age 18.
- Only buy from reliable fireworks sellers. Read and follow all warnings and instructions.

Use fireworks only as intended; don't try to alter or combine them, and don't experiment with homemade fireworks.

• Use fireworks outdoors only; keep them away from houses and flammable materials.

• Have a bucket of water nearby.

• Do not try to relight or handle malfunctioning fireworks. Soak them in water and throw them away. (Keep a bucket of water nearby for dousing.)

• Be sure other people are a safe distance away before lighting fireworks.

• Never ignite fireworks in a container — especially a glass or metal one.

• Store fireworks in a cool, dry place according to their specific storage instructions.

• Do not wear loose clothing near a fire or while using fireworks.

• Rockets should be

launched from a rocket launcher — not a bottle.

• Sparklers need to be handled carefully, too — they burn at more than 1,000 degrees Fahrenheit. Light them one at a time at arm's length. Always wear gloves while holding a sparkler, and never give one to a child under 5 years of age.

• Don't hold a child in your arms while using sparklers.

• Educate children (of all ages) about the dangers of fireworks and teach them to practice safety at all times.

• Don't mix alcohol and fireworks.

Before purchasing fireworks, familiarize yourself with your state's fireworks laws. Check [cpsc.gov/cpscpub/pubs/012.html](http://cpsc.gov/cpscpub/pubs/012.html) for the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission's list of state fireworks regulations. Also, check your local government's laws — many municipalities ban or restrict fireworks use.
