up with a plan to cut federal spending, Noem said.

"The Democrat is not the moderate Blue Dog she claims to be, Noem said.

"I plan to explain to the people of South Dakota why that is nothing more than a politician working hard to save her skin," the Republican said.

Herseht Sandlin said the stimulus plan was the right thing to do at the time and has created jobs in South Dakota. Republicans must accept responsibility for their spending under President George Bush, she said.

"They ran up this debt and deficit that led to the economic recession that we had, and my opponent voted three times (as a state representative) to balance the state's budget using recovery act dollars," Herseht Sandlin said. Herseht Sandlin said she has consistently voted to limit spending, restore fiscal discipline and stand up to leaders or presidents of either party.

Noem said if she is elected to Congress, she would support

repealing the health care law. "It's a killer to jobs and families."

Noem said Herseht Sandlin agreed not to seek the repeal of the health care measure in order to persuade Rapid City physician Kevin Weiland not to challenge her in a primary.

"It's simply not true and it doesn't matter how many times she says it it doesn't make it true," Herseht Sandlin said in response.

Herseht Sandlin has consistently said she would not seek to repeal the law, but instead would work to change the parts she finds objectionable.

Noem said Republicans believe in less intrusive government and low taxes to give small businesses a chance to succeed. She said President Obama and the Democratic Congress want higher taxes and more government control of business.

"So I will tell you that I'm going to draw a line. Enough is enough," Noem said.

Herseht Sandlin said Democrats will "set the record straight — the facts and the truth are on our side."

"It was their policies that caused this mess, cutting taxes for the wealthy while dramatically increasing spending, throwing away the balanced budget that took us so long to achieve," she said.
